ASPIRATIONAL DISTRICTS PROGRAMME (ADP)

- The Transformation of Aspirational Districts Programme was launched by Hon'ble Prime Minister in January, 2018 in 117 (including Baramulla and Kupwara) in most under developed Districts of the country.
- The programme seeks to focus in following sectors as these are important for all districts:
- 1.Health and Nutrition;
- 2.Education;
- 3. Agriculture and Water Resources;
- 4. Financial inclusion;
- 5.Skill development.
- 6.Basic Infrastructure including access to road, potable water, rural electrification and individual household toilets.
- The programme tracks 49 key performing indicators and 81 data- points across six themes with direct bearing on the quality of life and economic productivity of citizens. The themes and their weights are as follows:
