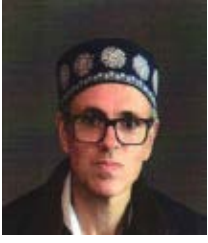

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Good governance is the process of measuring how public institutions conduct public affairs and manage public resources and guarantee the realization of public aspirations in a manner essentially free of abuse and corruption and with due regard for the rule of law. Good governance adds an evaluative attribute to the process of governing and based on different indicators, an index is computed to evaluate the performance and its impact.

One of the notable aspects of the DGGI reports is their emphasis on creating a healthy competition amongst district administrations to generate excellence in administrative affairs through best practices for the welfare of the general public. The success stories pouring in are an ample proof that release of DGGI reports is playing a catalytic role in making the district administrations more responsive and setting new benchmarks for other districts to emulate.

The DGGI has proven to be a valuable tool for promoting good governance, fostering healthy competition and driving innovation in Jammu and Kashmir. By continuously refining and expanding the scope of these reports, the government is demonstrating its commitment to establishing a transparent, accountable, and efficient governance system that caters to the needs of its citizens and drives sustainable development in the region.

The current issue of DGGI Report 4.0 is fourth edition in series based on data collected for the financial year 2023-24. The performance of District administrations of 20 Districts of UT of Jammu & Kashmir have been evaluated based on 10 sectors having significant role in the economy of the UT. Districts have been ranked based on scores achieved on 58 indicators spread across 10 selected sectors. Incremental change (increase/decrease) of the given indicators have been taken into consideration while calculating the scores.

District Jammu is on the top of composite ranking in DGGI 4.0 with an aggregate DGGI score of 6.9623 while as District Ramban is ranked at the bottom with aggregate DGGI score of 4.9728. District Srinagar & District Samba ranked 2nd and 3rd with an aggregate DGGI score of 6.5840 & 6.4812 respectively.

District Jammu consistently performed best in all sectors except Agriculture & Allied and Environment sectors where it stands at 13th & 12th rank respectively and finally occupies 1st rank in overall tally.

District Kishtwar is the best performer in Agriculture and allied Sector mainly due to better performance in the indicators of Food, Horticulture and Milk production.

District Srinagar is top performer in Industries and Allied Sector, followed by Districts of Jammu and Ganderbal as the indicators like MSME units registered, Establishment under GST, Credit to handicrafts & Credit to Self-employment marked an increase in these districts.

District Kulgam, Ganderbal & Shopian attained 1st, 2nd & 3rd rank under Human Resource Development sector by noticeable improvement in indicators like Gender Parity, Retention Rate, ST enrolment and availability of basic facilities in Schools.

District Jammu is ranked 1st in Public Health Sector followed by Districts Shopian & Anantnag. This ranking in Public Health sector is due to impetus given to the indicators like Institutional deliveries, Conversion of PHCs into Health and Wellness Centers, Immunization, FRUs and Golden cards.

Districts Samba, Srinagar & Shopian are top performers in Public Infrastructure and utilities sector with 1st, 2nd & 3rd ranks respectively, which reflects that these districts achieved targets of PMAY, Sanitation facilities, safe drinking water, households electrified and all weather roads under PMGSY.

District Kishtwar notched 1st rank under Social Welfare and Development sector followed by Jammu and Kathua Districts. Better performance in indicators like Adhaar seeding of Ration cards, Off-take of food-grains, Employment provided under MGNAREGA , Atal Pension Yojana and PMSBY helped these Districts to achieve top ranks in DGGI 4.0.

District Pulwama, Samba & Reasi ranked 1st, 2nd and 3rd respectively in Financial Inclusion Sector. Increase in value of indicators like Jan Dhan Yojna and Mudra loan scheme helped them to achieve this position in DGGI 4.0.

District Anantnag, Jammu and Udhampur ranked 1st, 2nd & 3rd in Legal & Public Safety sector. The DGGI 4.0 shows that District performed better in reducing frequency of crime against women & children besides, achieving higher conviction rate.

District Ganderbal, Shopian, Srinagar and Kishtwar ranked 1st in Environment Sector, while as, district Rajouri & Pulwama secured 2nd & 3rd place respectively. These positions are based on performance of indicators like forest cover and water bodies and wet lands.

District Reasi ranked 1st in Citizen Centric Governance Sector, while as Rajouri & Pulwama got the rank of 2nd & 3rd. Noticeable performance of these Districts is witnessed in Grievance Redressal & conversion of Government offices to E-office which helped them in achieving top-ranking in this sector under DGGI 4.0.

The DGGI 4.0 presents an insight of the district administration governance delivery mechanism and presents an avenue to gear up weaker areas and find innovative procedures & processes to bridge the gaps in targeted deliverables in a time bound manner. DGGI reports fosters healthy competition resulting in refinement of processes, innovation and finding avenues of hand holding which is ultimately beneficial to the society at large in establishing a vibrant and growing economy.

Way Ahead

To make DGGI more inclusive and comprehensive, additional indicators are being considered depending on the availability and suitability of indicators across the districts.

The DGGI Portal/dashboard is a crucial tool for computing indices and assessing governance performance. The roadmap entails improving the monthly portal/dashboard to make it more comprehensive and relevant. The annual DGGI is also being linked to the monthly DGG portal for consistent monitoring by the District administration for improving public service delivery mechanism.

CHAPTER 1



INTRODUCING THE DGGI

Introduction

Good governance is the process of measuring the performance of the Government institutions in managing the public resources and ensuring the realization of civil, cultural, economic, social and political rights of the society in a transparent manner. It protects the interests of the people and emphasizes on public sector management, legal developmental framework, accountability and transparency.

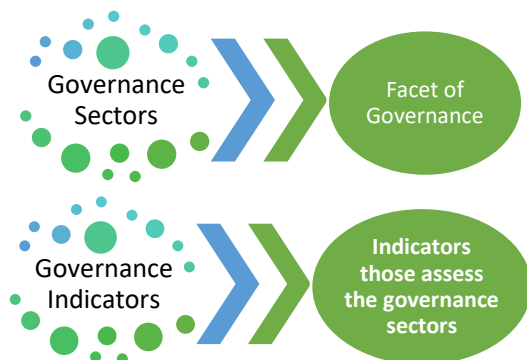
Good governance being the soul of public delivery system of a Government having measureable parameters through which it assesses the performance across various divisions/ units of an administrative setup over a period of time. District Good Governance Index (DGGI) is a comprehensive and implementable framework to assess the state of governance across the districts which enables ranking of Districts.

District is the primary unit of field administration under decentralized planning, engaged in implementation of various welfare programmes and projects for the well-being of the citizens. A proper measurement of the performance, therefore, becomes necessary to remain focused in delivering the services to the public which leads to holistic development of the administrative unit. Good governance initiatives are reflected over a period of time in people's participation, rule of law, transparency, responsiveness, consensus oriented, equity and Inclusiveness, effectiveness and efficiency, accountability, etc.

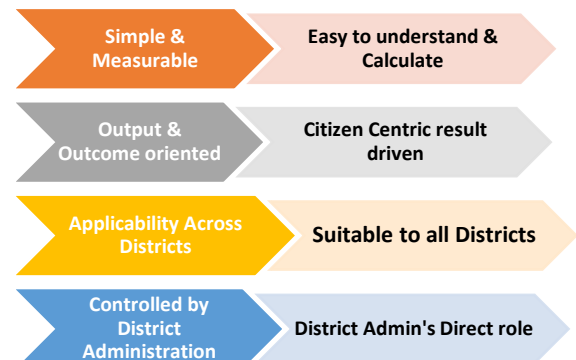
The main objective of assessing the performance of governance through District Good Governance Index (DGGI) in all 20 Districts of UT of Jammu and Kashmir based on identified sectors and indicators is to promote healthy competition and peer learning through best practices among the districts.

The present issue of DGGI 4.0 is fourth in the series which brings out comparative ranking of various Districts about Citizen Centric Governance and also generates healthy competition among districts. The DGGI 4.0 shall act as a reference document to the District Administration and other stake holders to bridge the gap in delivery of public good by identifying the low performers.

The components of the DGGI are:

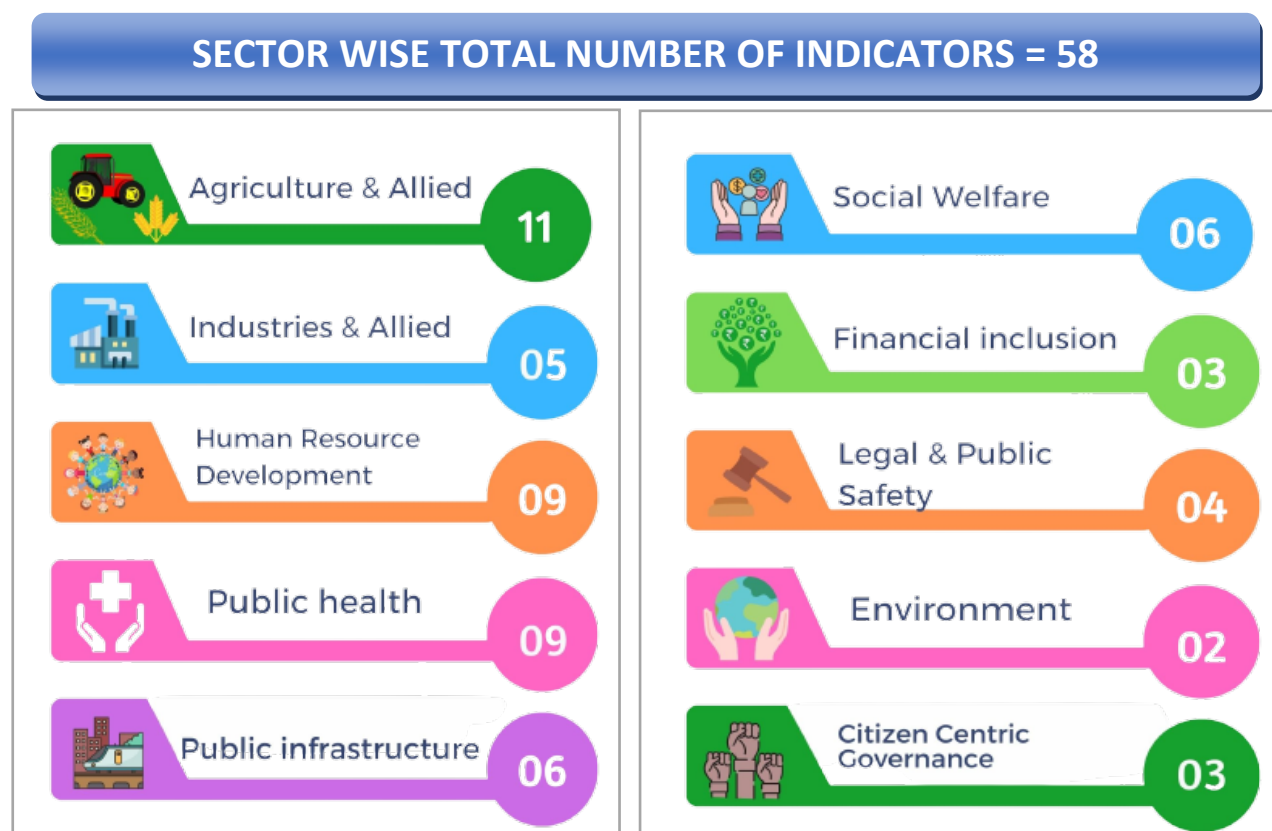


The Principles of indicator Selection are:



DGGI 4.0 Methodology

20 districts of the UT have been ranked on the basis of data captured from the districts on 58 indicators under 10 sectors. The methodology and set of indicators used in first three editions of DGGI has been adopted for calculating sector and indicator-wise scores to arrive at final ranking of the districts in DGGI 4.0.



The data on the identified sectors/ selected indicators has been obtained from the districts and has been scrutinized/ analyzed by the Directorate of Economics and Statistics and put to further calculation as per the decided methodology and formulas for the measurement of Good Governance Index.

- In some indicators, growth over the period has been measured while as others are target driven.
- The raw data has been normalized using Dimensional Index Method and subsequently used for ranking purpose after applying the respective weight-age assigned to the indicators.
- Sectors have been assigned equal weights.
- Scores of selected indicators have been aggregated to arrive at the Sector Score and thereby arriving at a Sector Rank. Sector Scores are then aggregated for calculating the Composite District Score.

Computation of DGGI 4.0

Step I: Compilation of Necessary Data/ Information

Computation of scores for different indicators under 10 sectors prescribed in the DGGI Framework requires data on a large number of facets covering various aspects of governance at district level. The reference year used for growth based indicators in the DGGI 1.0, 2.0 & 3.0 has been kept intact. The data for this purpose has been collected from the District Development Commissioners.

Step II: Normalization of Indicator Values

Variables with mixed scales have been converted into dimensionless entities, so that they can be compared and used for ranking purpose easily, which is known as **normalization**. There are various methods available to normalize variables and attain scores for the Districts based on their performance on the identified indicators for compiling sector-wise/district-wise ranking. For the purpose of ranking the Districts as part of DGGI, the **Dimensional Index Methodology** has been used.

In this method, the normalized value of each indicator is obtained by subtracting the minimum value among the set from the raw value of indicators and then dividing it by the data range (maximum – minimum value). The maximum and minimum values for each indicator are ascertained based on the raw values for that indicator across the Districts – combining all Districts without considering the existing Divisional (Jammu and Kashmir Divisions) categorization. This approach is specifically adopted so that such calculation would permit comparison across all Districts and can also be used for generating overall ranks – without considering the categorization.

The following two equations have been used to normalise the indicator values:

Dimensional Score for Positive Indicators:

$$\text{Score} = \frac{(\text{Indicator Value} - \text{Minimum Value})}{(\text{Maximum Value} - \text{Minimum Value})}$$

Dimensional Score for Negative Indicators:

$$\text{Score} = \frac{(\text{Maximum Value} - \text{Indicator Value})}{(\text{Maximum Value} - \text{Minimum Value})}$$

Where

Positive Indicator = for which Higher Value is better

Negative Indicator = for which Lower Value is better

Indicator Value = Available through Secondary Sources

Maximum Value = Highest Indicator Value among the Districts

Minimum Value = Lowest Indicator Value among the Districts

The above-mentioned equations has been used directly by taking the values of indicators for reference year. In case of the growth-based indicators, this exercise has been undertaken after calculating Compound Annual Growth Rate (CAGR) over base year to reference year for each indicator. The following equation has been used for calculating CAGR:

$$\text{CAGR} = \left(\frac{\text{value of Reference Year}}{\text{value of Base Year}} \right)^{\left(\frac{1}{n}\right)-1} \times 100$$

where: n = number of periods

Step III: Assigning Weightages

a. Equal Weightage to Sectors:

As mentioned earlier, while conceptualizing DGGI, various aspects of governance, which are critical for growth, development and inclusiveness have been measured which have been clustered under ten sectors. All the identified ten sectors are facets of equal importance from the point of view of citizen-centric approach for such comprehensive index at District level.

b. Differential Weightages for Indicators:

Outcome / output-based indicators were given priority for indicator selection and at the same time selection was restricted due to availability of data. Therefore, the outcome / output-based indicators are assigned higher weightage whereas proxy indicators (input/process based) are assigned lower weightage. Assigning higher weightages to outcome/output-based indicators brings the focus on performance and achievements of the Districts.

Step IV: Computation of Scores and Ranking

After completing data normalization process, the normalized value of each indicator needs to be multiplied with weightage assigned to the indicator in order to obtain the final indicator score. These final individual indicator scores are aggregated to obtain a value for the sector. These aggregated values after multiplication with indicator weight becomes the score for the sector and once sector wise scores are aggregated, it becomes District's DGGI Score to be used for ranking purpose.

Methodology to Measure District Performance (Indicator-wise)

To assess the performance of the district across various indicators, specific targets have been established for many of these indicators. For some indicators, national targets have been adopted, while for others, health and human resource-related targets are aligned with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Targets are generally set as percentages, and performance is evaluated based on the percentage achieved. In certain cases, productivity is measured against national targets to be met. In other instances, the highest achievements recorded serve as the benchmark for the targets.

It is important to note that the primary focus of this approach is to measure improvements within the district relative to these established targets.

Limitations

Every statistical inference is bound to have accuracy to a limit, therefore, results cannot be 100% accurate and as per the expectations of the stake holders. However, every statistician tries to increase the level of accuracy and arrive at the most accurate results. It is also a fact, that while working on the indices, the hypothesis, selection of set of indicators and the methodology used determines the outcome of the study. If the hypothesis is subject to change, the results will automatically vary.

The results of this document (DGGI 4.0) are based on the methodology and set of indicators used in previous three editions of DGGI, which was vetted by Center for Good Governance, Hyderabad that primarily focuses on delta changes. However, the system is evolving and the directorate is open to make changes in the methodology as well as set of indicators with time based on the willingness of the departments concerned/ districts and availability of data from these sources.

Ranking with Final Score (UT)

Composite DGGI 4.0 score of 20 districts was computed at UT level by aggregating the scores of 10 sectors i.e i. Agriculture & Allied Sectors ii. Industries & Allied Sectors iii. Human Resource Development iv. Public Health v. Public Infrastructure & Utilities vi. Financial Inclusion vii. Social Welfare & Development viii. Legal & Public Safety ix. Environment x. Citizen Centric Governance.

District Jammu has secured rank first in the DGGI 2023-24 with an aggregate composite score of 6.9623 while as District Srinagar and District Samba have secured 2nd and 3rd ranks with an average composite score of 6.5840 and 6.4812 respectively.

District Jammu performed best in Industries & Commerce, Public Health, Social Welfare & Development and Judiciary & Public Safety while as District Srinagar has topped in Industries & Commerce and Public Infrastructure and Environment. District Samba has secured rank first in Public Infrastructure and Financial Inclusion. District Kishtwar has topped in Agriculture and Social Welfare, Kulgam in Human Resource Development, District Pulwama in Financial Inclusion while as District Anantnag in Legal & Public Safety and District Reasi in Citizen Centric Governance Sectors.

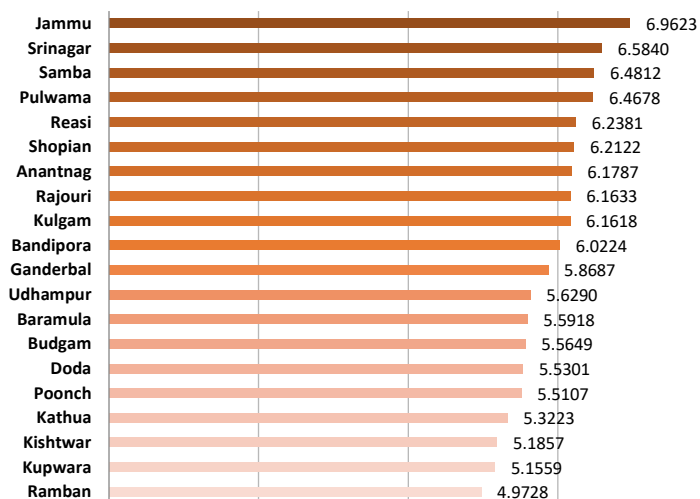


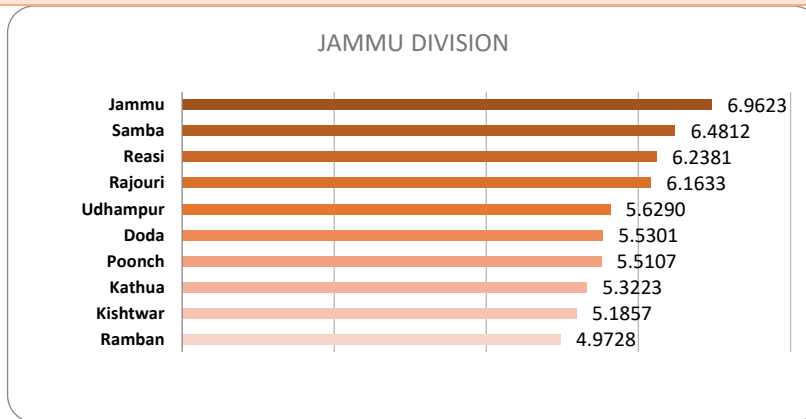

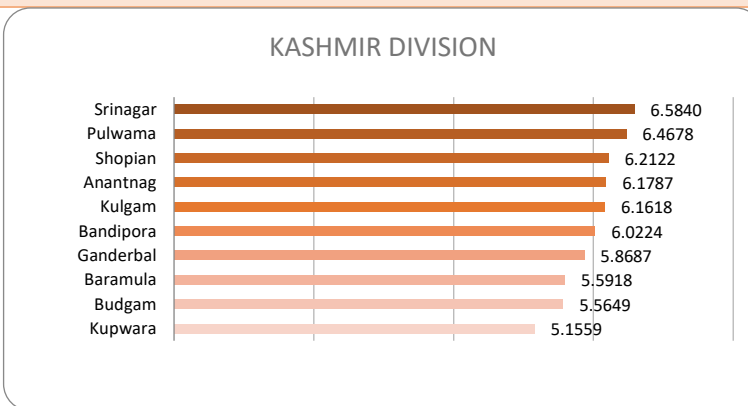

Rank wise comparison of districts in DGGI 4.0 vis a vis 3.0

The ranking of districts for DGGI 4.0 (2023-24) is based on 58 indicators spread over 10 sectors by following the methodology as discussed earlier. The composite DGGI 4.0 ranking of districts has been arrived at by aggregating the scores of 10 sectors i.e. Agriculture & Allied, Industries & Allied, Human Resource Development, Public Health, Public Infrastructure & Utilities, Financial Inclusion, Social Welfare & Development, Legal & Public Safety, Environment, and Citizen Centric Grievance.

The primary objective of DGGI is to present the State of Governance in the districts and initiate healthy competition among the districts of the UT of Jammu & Kashmir. The end result is to improve citizen services and make governance at the district level more inclusive and accountable. To achieve this objective, a comparative analysis of districts in terms of rank-wise performance in DGGI 4.0 vis a vis 3.0 has been drawn to create competitiveness amongst the districts in future. The comparison is presented below:

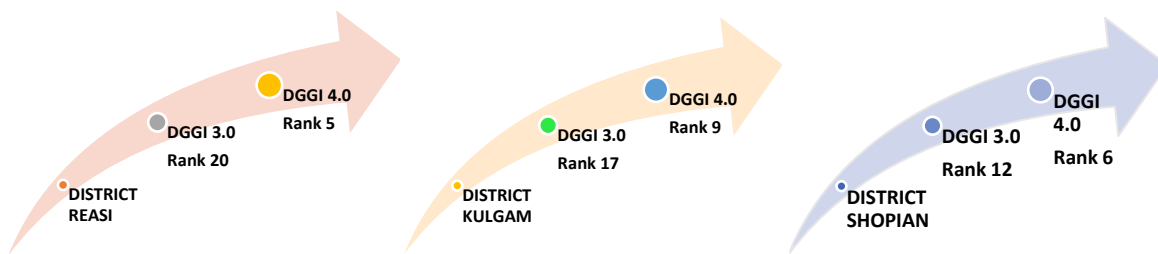

Achievers

District Reasi has climbed to 5th rank in 2023-24 from 20th rank in 2022-23. The district has improved its performance in 8 sectors out of 10 particularly in Citizen Centric Governance (from rank 20th in 2022-23 to 1st in 2023-24).

District Kulgam has also upgraded its performance from rank 17th in DGGI 3.0 to 9th in DGGI 4.0, with remarkable improvement in Public infrastructure, Legal and Public safety, Environment and Citizen Centric Governance out of 8 best performed sectors in DGGI 4.0.



So far as District Shopian is concerned, commendable performance has been noticed in Citizen Centric Governance and Legal & Public safety sectors besides 6 other sectors of better performance, thus upgrading its annual performance from rank 12th to 6th in DGGI 4.0

Low performers

District Bandipora slipped to rank 10th in DGGI 4.0 from rank 4th in DGGI 3.0. The districts though its performance in 5 Sectors, still slip in overall ranking due to low performance in other 5 sectors especially in Environment from 1st to 16th rank, Citizen Centric Governance from 5th to 12th and Financial Inclusion from 5th to 10th.

District Kupwara secured 19th rank in DGGI 4.0 as compared to its 14th position in DGGI 3.0. The districts improved its performance in 4 Sectors, but due to drastic decline of ranking in Environment sector from 2nd to 17th in DGGI 4.0 besides slight low performance in 5 sectors i.e Agriculture, Public Infrastructure, Public Health, Social Welfare and Legal and Public Safety sectors overall ranking of the district has been declined in DGGI 4.0.

So far as District Doda among the low performing Districts is concerned, its overall ranking in DGGI 4.0 stood at 15th as compared to 9th in DGGI 3.0. Major sectors responsible for this decline in ranking are Public Health (from 8th to 15th) and Citizen Centric Governance (from 4th to 11th), though slip in ranking has also been noticed in Human Resource Development, Public Infrastructure, Social Welfare & Legal & Public Safety Sectors.

Sector-wise Performance of Districts

The Good Governance Index 4.0 provides a comprehensive analysis of the governance performance in the UT of Jammu & Kashmir, specifically focusing on 20 districts. It assesses the performance of these districts across multiple sectors, offering valuable insights into their governance practices. The index encompasses 10 key sectors, namely Agriculture & Allied, Industries & Allied, Human Resource Development, Public Health, Public Infrastructure & Utilities, Financial Inclusion, Social Welfare & Development, Legal & Public Safety, Environment, and Citizen Centric Grievance. By evaluating the scores obtained in each sector and aggregating them, the index generates rankings that reflect the overall governance performance of the districts

Agriculture and Allied sectors encompass the governance aspects of the Primary sector covering agricultural horticulture and Livestock. Agriculture and Allied sectors play a vital role in the economy of UT of Jammu & Kashmir. The UT has a distinct geographical feature having two agro-climatic zones and each zone has its own particular climatic character that describes its cropping pattern, productivity, production etc. The agriculture sector in UT faces challenges on demand and supply fronts. The Government is contemplating to ensure doubling farmers income and reduce agrarian distress. Various initiatives are taken in order to improve the efficiency of this sector. To maintain parity and have a sense of cohesion an attempt has been made to follow proper sub-sector stratification while preparation and finalization of good governance index on the basis of selected indicators. Only generic indicators have been included. 11 indicators have been identified under this sector with a focus on output and institutional support like crop insurance, animal vaccination, kisan credit card, soil health card etc.

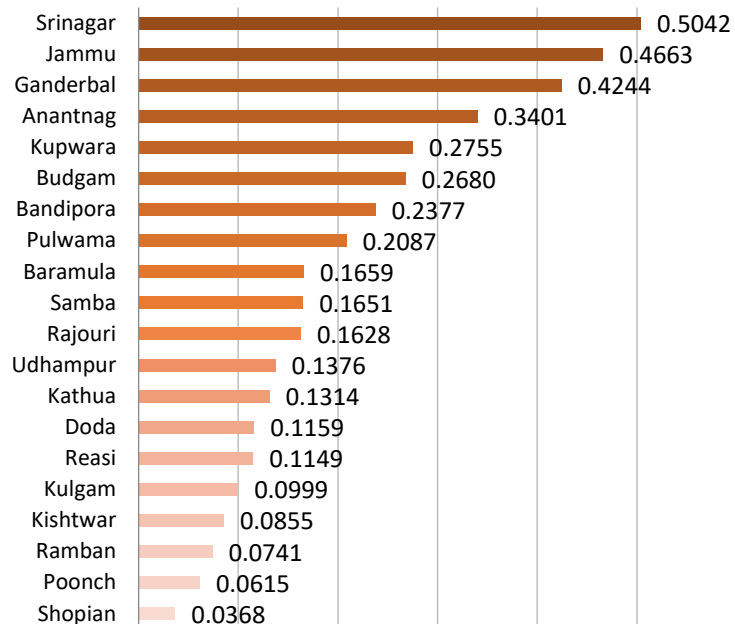

Industries & Allied Sector is a key to growth of the economy and it has a rippling effect with increase in employment. However, the government is giving much emphasis for Industrial development in the UT to boost the economy besides reducing unemployment. Despite numerous difficulties like lack of adequate basic infrastructure, difficult terrain etc, the Government is coming up with number of schemes for the development of Industries & Commerce and to boost the economy, Gross State Domestic Product and generate employment avenues in the UT of J&K. Union Government is laying emphasis on adoption of G2B model to promote industry and commerce. Most of the indicators for this particular sector are calculated at the UT level, therefore for the purpose of DGGI some proxy indicators such as establishment registered for Goods and Service Tax (GST), Micro, small and medium Enterprises (MSME) establishments, etc are included. Tourism, being an important economic and commercial activity of the J&K, an indicator pertaining to number of tourist visited has been also included. Combined together, these indicators would reflect the achievement of a particular District for promoting economic activities in the District. It is critical that the recent interventions of attracting good number of diverse industries now needs to be measured by way of indicators like growth in GST registered establishments, MSMEs and credit to handicrafts & allied sectors, self-employment etc.

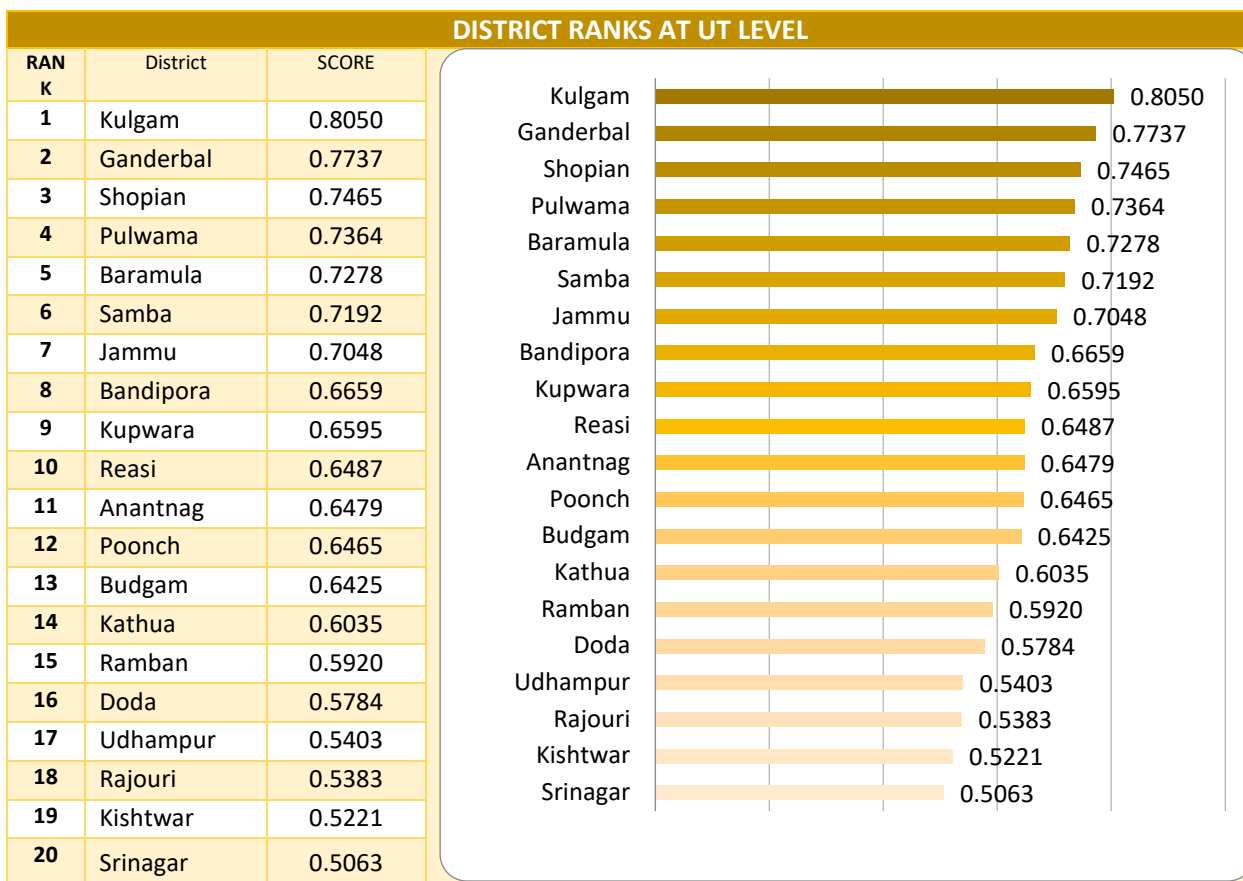



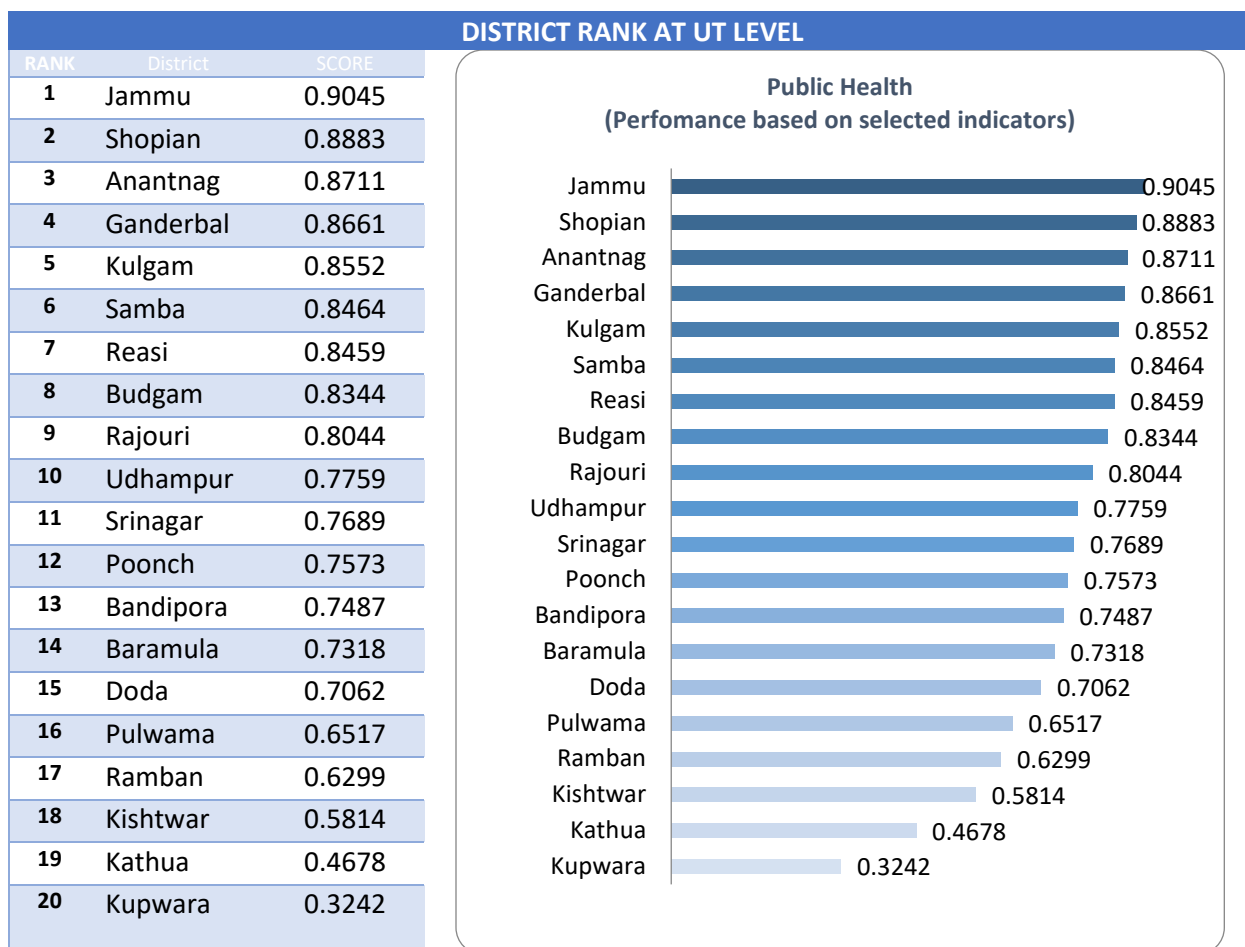

4. PUBLIC HEALTH



A direct consequence of a nation's poor health on its economy is through the adverse impact on its human capital. Health capital contributes more to wealth than other dimensions. Health sector is central to the well-being and progress of the nation, an employment generator, a productivity enhancer and a driver of innovation and entrepreneurship. Encouraging improvements have been recorded in the demographic and health status indicators of the Union Territory over a period of time. Under this sector, nine key indicators are measured looking at the outcomes like Maternal Mortality Ratio (MMR), Infant Mortality Rate (IMR), Immunization achievement etc. while J&K in general is above performing UT in terms of Health parameters such as MMR and IMR. Measuring the performance of these critical indicators and comparing between the Districts provides opportunity to design targeted intervention in lagging Districts. Overall operationalization and resources availability are also captured through indicator such as Health and Wellness Centers (HWCs), Anganwadis with own buildings etc. Similarly, other indicators in this sector like distribution of Ayushman Bharat Golden card, functioning of FRUs etc. are outcome of available infrastructure, right policies and streamlined processes.

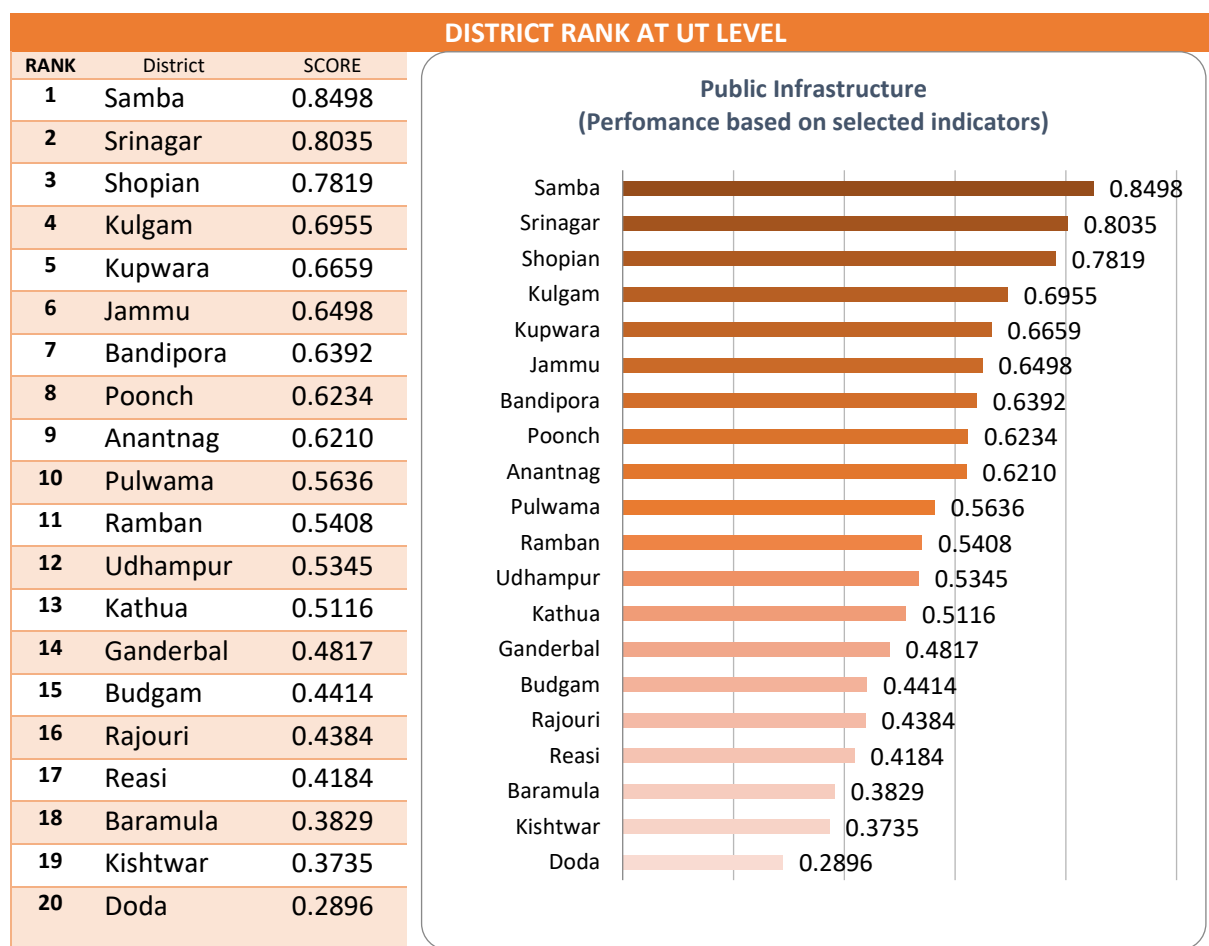

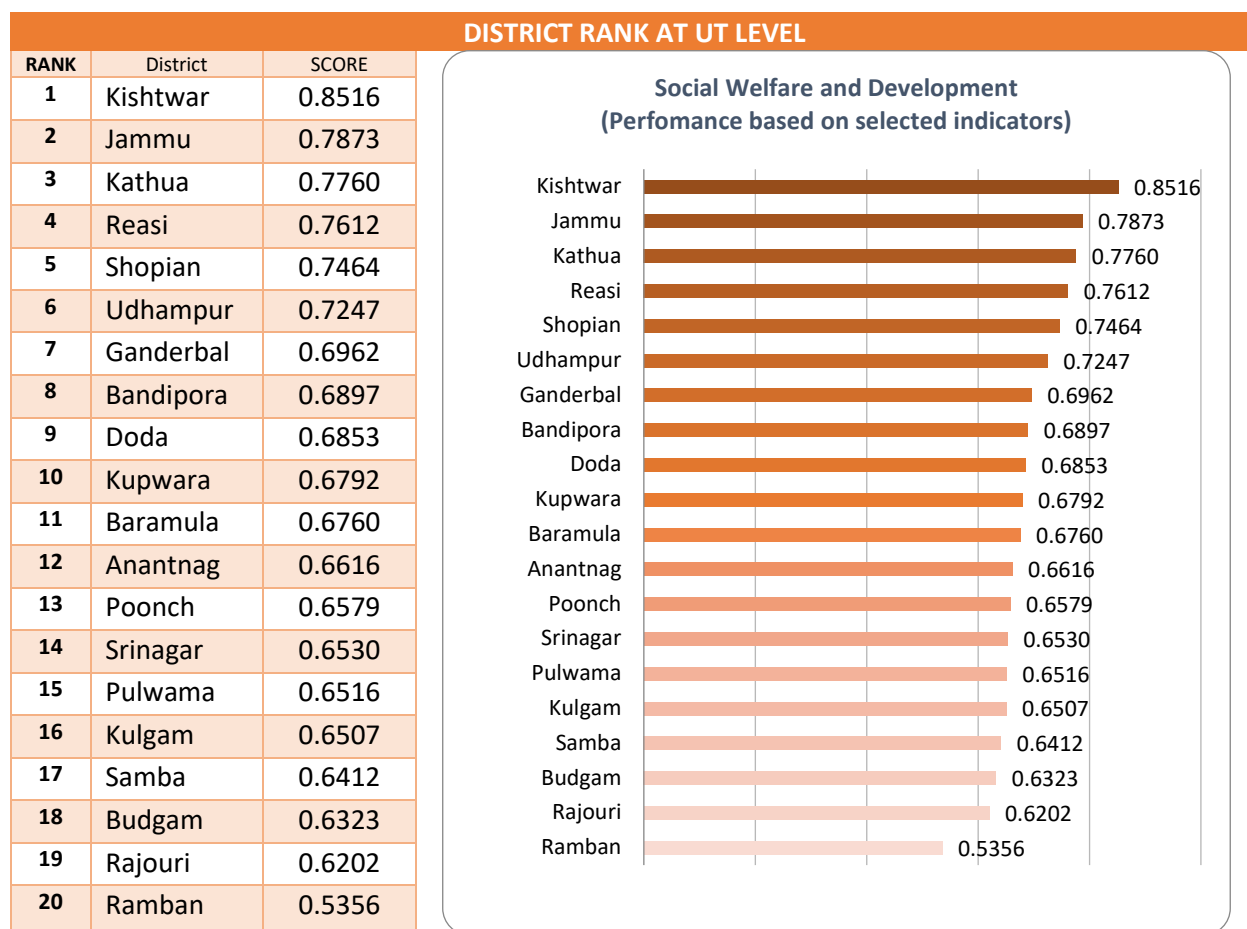


6. SOCIAL WELFARE & DEVELOPMENT

A healthy environment provides the basic necessities of life, like water, food and air. It also provides resources for economic growth and the means to fight natural hazards. Indicators linked to environment are evaluated to measure the success in minimizing negative externalities on the environment. Data describing environmental indicators can be spatially and temporally referenced to understand changes to the environment over space and time and are thus an important tool in facilitating environmental governance. Hence, good governance practices can effectively and efficiently bring out better environmental outcomes that ensure reduced levels of carbon dioxide emissions, adequate forest covers, and higher consumption of renewable energy vis-à-vis non-renewable energy. Realizing the criticality of environmental sustainability for sustainable development, environment has been taken as a separate sector. As depleting forest area is a main area of concern, the change in forest cover has been included as an indicator in the sector. The Indicator selection under this sector was particularly constrained due to limited availability of homogeneous data/ information across the districts. However, a beginning has been made through DGGI framework, which would be built-upon in subsequent editions of the Index.

(Since no change in forest cover during 2022-23 & 2023-24 has been reported by the districts, full weightage score has been allocated to all the Districts at par in DGGI 4.0, which does not affect overall progress of the district)

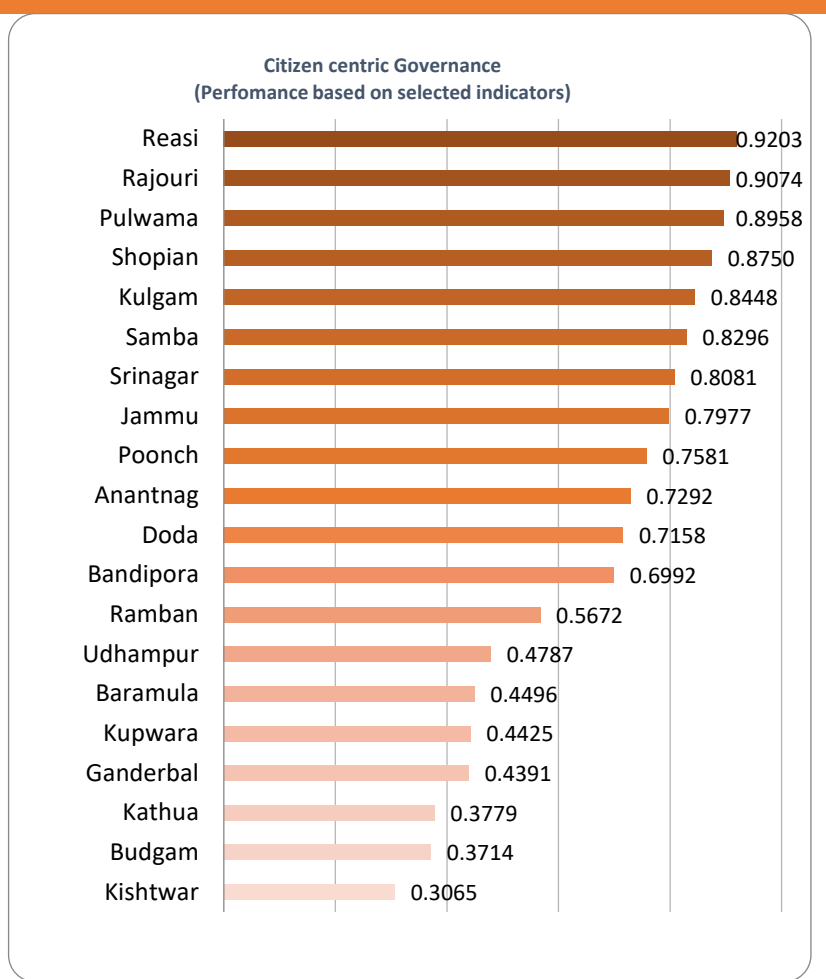

CHAPTER 4



Outcomes and Impact Assessment

Good governance is an important factor in promoting holistic development. Since the district is a basic unit of field administration and governance, it is crucial to measure the performance of districts in implementing various programs and innovative projects for the well-being of citizens. The District Good Governance Index (DGGI), an initiative of the UT of J&K, was introduced to measure the performance of districts across identified sectors and indicators of governance. This index has fostered competitiveness among districts in delivering the benefits of government programs and schemes to the targeted population.

Comparison between DGGI 3.0 and 4.0 reveals that some districts have shown remarkable improvement. Districts such as Reasi, Kulgam, Shopian, Pulwama Poonch Srinagar and Udhampur and have significantly enhanced their rankings.

District Reasi, which was ranked 20th in DGGI 3.0, has now climbed to 5th place in DGGI 4.0. The district has excelled in sectors such as Citizen Centric Governance, HRD, Financial Inclusion, Legal & Public Safety, Industries and Commerce, Public Infra, Social Welfare and Environment Sectors. This indicates that the district administration has made tremendous efforts to improve performance in 8 out of 10 sectors. The targets set for these sectors have been satisfactorily achieved, leading to the successful implementation of schemes and benefits reaching the masses.

District Kulgam, previously ranked 17th in DGGI 3.0, has now secured the 9th position in DGGI 4.0. The district has made progress in the sectors of Public Health, Public Infra, Citizen Centric Governance, Environment, Legal & Public Safety, Public Health, Industries & Commerce, HRD and Financial Inclusion. The targets set for these sectors have been satisfactorily achieved, resulting in the dissemination of scheme benefits to the masses.

District Shopian has significantly improved its ranking from 12th to 6th by performing exceptionally well in the sectors like Citizen Centric Governance, Legal & Public Safety, Public Health, Environment, Public Infra, Human Resource Development, Social Welfare and Financial Inclusion. Implementation of interventions such as door-to-door garbage collection, solid and liquid waste management, and provision of dustbins has improved sanitation facilities in urban and rural areas. Moreover, the district has taken numerous initiatives in the Citizen Centric Governance sector, such as timely grievance redressal and the introduction of online services, for the convenience of the general public.

District Pulwama, which was ranked 8th in DGGI 3.0, has achieved the 4th rank in DGGI 4.0. The district has made improvements in CCG, Environment, Public infrastructure, Legal & Public Safety, Industries and Commerce, Human Resource Development and Public Health. In Public Health Sector parameters, including institutional deliveries, full immunization, and Ayushman cards, through the organization of special camps and outreach programs. In Citizen Centric Governance, the district has taken several initiatives like timely grievance redressal besides online services for the convenience of general public.

District Poonch jumped upward from rank 19th in DGGI 3.0 to rank 16th in DGGI 4.0 with improvements in Sectors like CCG, Public Health, Agriculture & Allied, Social Welfare and Legal & Public Safety. This shows the efforts put forth by the District Administration in ensuring percolation of benefits of Government schemes to general public.

District Srinagar, previously ranked 3rd in DGGI 3.0, has attained the 2nd rank in DGGI 4.0. The district has shown excellent improvement in Legal & Public Safety, Citizen Centric Governance and Environment.

With the introduction of DGGI, a state of competitiveness amongst the Districts has been emerged. This has really broadened the scope of various Government Programmes/schemes and

is being ultimately resulting into narrowing of gap between the Government and the Governed. The impact can be observed on ground, as districts are competing with each other to secure top rankings. This can only be achieved by meeting targets under the 10 identified sectors of governance, involving 58 indicators. The Sector wise details are given below:-

AGRICULTURE & ALLIED SECTOR

The agricultural landscape across different districts has showcased significant growth and positive trends in various sectors. When it comes to food grain production, nine districts have consistently displayed a positive Cumulative Annual Growth Rate (CAGR) from FY 2018-19 to FY 2023-24. Among them, Kishtwar and Srinagar have emerged as the front runners with an impressive CAGR of 8% and 6% respectively. This growth signifies the Government's commitment to enhancing food grain production and ensuring a sustainable agricultural future.



In the domain of horticulture produce, 14 districts have made notable progress with a positive CAGR during the same period. Notably, Pulwama, Kishtwar and Doda districts have exhibited remarkable growth, leading the pack with a CAGR of 7.32, 6.99% and 6.92% respectively. This achievement underscores the district's favourable climatic conditions and agricultural practices that have contributed to the flourishing horticulture sector. The diversification of agricultural activities beyond traditional crops bodes well for the overall economic development of these districts.



The dairy industry has also experienced encouraging growth, with 13 districts showcasing a positive trend in milk production during FY 2023-24. District Kishtwar has emerged as the top performer in milk production, contributing 39.04% to the overall output followed by Kathua and Samba districts contributing 13.31% and 12.89%, respectively to the overall output. These numbers demonstrate the potential of these districts in the dairy sector and highlight the efforts taken to improve productivity and meet the growing demand for dairy products.



Furthermore, the livestock sector has witnessed positive developments as well. 15 districts have displayed a favorable CAGR in meat production with Srinagar district leading the way with a remarkable CAGR of 4.71%. Similarly, in poultry production, 16 districts have experienced positive growth, with district Udhampur boasting the highest CAGR of 31.42%. These advancements in livestock and poultry production contribute to the overall agricultural prosperity of the UT, supporting the livelihoods of farmers and boosting the economy.

2. INDUSTRIES & ALLIED SECTOR

The industrial sector in Jammu & Kashmir is considered a vital driver of economic activity and an effective solution to combat unemployment among educated youths. In recent years,



significant efforts have been made to develop industrial infrastructure with the aim of attracting investments to the UT. This focus includes providing the necessary framework and support for industrial growth. The development of industrial infrastructure serves a dual role: facilitating industrial investments and contributing to overall development.



The fiscal year 2023-24 witnessed a significant increase in the number of establishments registered under the Goods and Services Tax (GST) in the UT of Jammu & Kashmir. Among the districts, Jammu stood out with the highest percentage of registrations, accounting for 25% of the total registrations. Srinagar and Anantnag followed behind; with 13.55% and 13.46% registrations respectively. This surge in GST registrations reflects a growing business landscape and economic activity in these districts.



The Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSME) sector also experienced notable registrations under the Online Udyam platform during the same fiscal year. District Srinagar and Anantnag were at the forefront, contributing



15.18% and 11.93% respectively of the total MSME unit registrations. District Jammu and Budgam accounted for 9.96% and 9.10% respectively of the total registrations, showcasing a considerable presence of MSME units in these areas. This trend indicates the flourishing entrepreneurial spirit and the potential for job creation and economic development in these districts.



The Handicrafts sector in the UT of Jammu & Kashmir witnessed an increase in credit support during the fiscal year 2023-24, District Ganderbal emerged as the front-runner, experiencing a remarkable achievement of 51.49% in the credit provided to the Handicrafts sector. On the other hand, District Reasi registered a modest achievement of 0.32%. These numbers highlight the varying degrees of financial support to the Handicrafts industry in different districts, with Ganderbal demonstrating robust growth and Reasi showing a marginal increase. This indicates the importance of targeted interventions to boost the Handicrafts sector's development and economic impact across the UT.

3. HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT SECTOR

The Human Resource Development sector plays a crucial role in driving socio-economic development and effective governance. It is widely recognized that a nation's human resources are its most valuable assets. Human Resource Development encompasses various aspects that are vital for overall progress. These include promoting gender parity by ensuring equal opportunities and empowering women, enhancing skill capabilities through vocational training and upskilling programs, providing adequate nutritional support for healthy development, improving retention rates within the territory, increasing literacy rates to foster a knowledgeable



society, and ensuring equitable school enrollment ratios for marginalized communities such as scheduled castes and scheduled tribes.

Significant progress has been made in promoting gender parity across the districts. Out of the 20 districts, Kulgam & Srinagar deserves special recognition for achieving a perfect Gender Parity Index of 100%. Moreover, fourteen Districts have surpassed a gender parity index of above 90%, demonstrating substantial improvement in ensuring equal access to education for all.

Efforts to enhance the quality of education are also evident. A noteworthy accomplishment is the impressive retention rates of above 90% observed in 15 districts, with Pulwama and Samba districts leading the way with a flawless retention rate of 100% at the secondary level. Significant strides have been made in maintaining optimal pupil-teacher ratios, in 14 districts, the pupil-teacher ratio ranges from an excellent 1:12 to 1:15, ensuring students receive the necessary attention and support for their educational journey.



Infrastructure development and access to basic facilities have also received considerable attention. 4 districts have achieved 100% availability of drinking water, separate toilet facilities, and electricity, while as another 7 districts have achieved above 90%. However, there is still work to be done in the remaining 9 districts, where availability falls below 90%, with Udhampur district having the lowest availability rate at 76.70%.



Moreover, Jammu & Kashmir has recognized the significance of digital literacy by equipping schools with computer access. District Shopian stands out with 100% of schools having access to computers, enabling students to develop crucial technological skills. Furthermore, the UT has prioritized comprehensive skill training, with 14 districts successfully providing 100% training to all registered students, fostering holistic development.

These signify that focused attention has been given to the Human Resource Development of the UT. The focus on gender parity, retention rates, pupil-teacher ratios, infrastructure, digital literacy, and skill training demonstrates a commitment to providing quality education and promoting the overall well-being of the population. These efforts lay the foundation for a prosperous future for the UT.

4. PUBLIC HEALTH

Public health plays a pivotal role in driving development and ensuring the well-being of individuals within the Union Territory, as a significant portion of the population relies on the Government Health Care System to meet their healthcare needs. Recognizing the importance of healthcare, the government remains committed to shaping, strengthening, supporting, and sustaining the healthcare delivery system to provide every citizen with accessible, high-quality, and



comprehensive health services. The majority of districts have achieved impressive rates of full immunization coverage, with almost all districts reporting immunization rates of 100%. Only district Kupwara falls slightly below this mark with a immunization rate of 99.67%. This achievement reflects the successful implementation of vaccination programs and highlights the dedication of healthcare professionals and community outreach efforts.

Institutional delivery rates also demonstrate positive trends across the districts. 10 districts have accomplished 100% institutional deliveries, indicating the improved accessibility and availability of healthcare facilities for expectant mothers. Additionally, 5 other districts have achieved between 91% to 99% institutional deliveries, emphasizing the importance of proper medical care during childbirth and the need to continue efforts to increase institutional delivery rates further.



Overall, while certain areas still require targeted interventions to address specific health indicators, significant progress has been made in various aspects of healthcare across the districts. Continued efforts, including increased accessibility to healthcare services, improved infrastructure, and effective outreach programs, will be instrumental in further enhancing the overall health outcomes and ensuring the well-being of its residents.

5. PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE AND UTILITIES

Infrastructure facilities and utility services are crucial components of a well-functioning society, directly impacting the quality of life and overall development of communities. Recognizing their significance, the government has prioritized these sectors and ensured their efficient operation.

Significant progress has been made in various developmental initiatives across several districts in Jammu and Kashmir. Under the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (PMAY), the housing for all scheme, Ramban, Samba and Srinagar districts have demonstrated exceptional performance, with Ramban leading the way by reaching a remarkable 99.82% completion of sanctioned houses.



Additionally, 4 districts have achieved a commendable range of 80% to 90% progress and 6 districts have achieved range of 60% to 80% in providing housing for all. This highlights the significant efforts and commitment towards ensuring adequate housing for the residents of these districts. Moreover, the provision of safe drinking water has been a priority in Jammu and Kashmir. Notably, Ganderbal district has set a remarkable example by achieving 100% access to safe drinking water facilities for both its rural and urban households. Furthermore, 4 other districts viz. Srinagar, Samba, Reasi & Shopian

have made substantial progress, ensuring safe drinking water access to over 90% of their population. Among rest of the districts, 12 districts falls under the category of 70% to 89%

achievement and 3 districts under 50% to 69%. These accomplishments underscore the commitment towards improving the quality of life and addressing essential needs of the people in these districts.

The focus on sanitation and electrification has yielded positive results in several districts of Jammu and Kashmir. An impressive number of eleven districts have achieved an outstanding 100% access to sanitation facilities, while 9 other districts have attained a commendable range of 95% and above.

This signifies the efforts taken to enhance sanitation facilities, promoting better hygiene practices and ensuring a healthier environment for the residents.



In terms of electrification, 12 districts have successfully achieved the target of electrifying 100% of households. Additionally, 5 districts are on the verge of accomplishing this milestone, while the remaining districts have shown significant improvement in household electrification. This progress in electrification initiatives reflects the commitment to providing a reliable and efficient power supply to all households in the UT.



Furthermore, the development of all-weather roads has been a key priority under the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY). District Srinagar has achieved 100% target, showcasing its efforts to improve connectivity and accessibility. Moreover, 11 other districts have made substantial progress, with over 90% completion of the total sanctioned kilometers and rest 8 districts have achieved target of 68.2% and above of all-weather roads. Notably, Kulgam district stands out for achieving 95.74% followed by 13 districts achieving between range of 70% to 90% conversion of roads to black top roads, demonstrating their commitment to enhancing infrastructure and ensuring smoother transportation networks.

Overall, these accomplishments in housing, safe drinking water, sanitation, electrification, and road infrastructure highlight the substantial progress made in improving the quality of life and overall development in various districts of Jammu and Kashmir.

6. SOCIAL WELFARE AND DEVELOPMENT

Social development is a critical aspect of any society and ensuring the welfare of its citizens, particularly those who are neglected and downtrodden, forms the core of this development. Social welfare programs play a vital role in targeting and assisting vulnerable individuals, preventing them from succumbing to hunger, poverty, and other adversities. These programmes aim to bridge the gap and provide equal opportunities to those who are less privileged in society. All the districts have successfully accomplished the goal of Aadhaar seeding for ration cards, reaching an impressive 100% coverage.

With this milestone, the government aims to enhance transparency and eliminate any possibility of duplication or fraud in the public distribution system, ensuring that the benefits of subsidized food grains reach the intended beneficiaries without any obstacles.



Off-take of Grains - A total of 12 districts have demonstrated exemplary performance by uplifting the entirety of sanctioned food grains under TPDS and SSS, while seven districts have achieved over 83% to 99.99% off-take of food grains. This remarkable accomplishment reflects the effective implementation of distribution mechanisms, ensuring a steady flow of food grains to the designated distribution centers and subsequently to the households in need. The government's focus on improving the off-take of grains aims to address food security concerns and alleviate hunger, ensuring that the allocated food grains are efficiently utilized to meet the nutritional requirements of the population.



7. FINANCIAL INCLUSION

Financial Inclusion facilitates individuals and businesses gaining access to suitable, affordable, and prompt financial products and services.

The evaluation of financial inclusion for the poor and marginalized relies on diverse indicators, including metrics like the Jan Dhan Yojana program's impact on financial inclusion and the disbursement of Mudra Loans, among others.

Financial inclusion under the Jan Dhan Yojana has seen varying degrees of success, with only 10 districts managing to open Jan Dhan accounts for more than 50% of eligible beneficiaries. In terms of the total disbursement of Mudra loans per one lakh population, Pulwama and Ganderbal districts have emerged as the frontrunners, providing the highest financial support under the Mudra scheme. When it comes to the disbursement of funds for self-employment schemes, most districts have demonstrated a positive trend, except for Shopian. Notably, Srinagar district has recorded the highest compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 170.86% in offering financial assistance under the self-employment scheme.



8. LEGAL AND PUBLIC SAFETY

Public safety is the first and the foremost duty of the Government to ensure the effectiveness of laws and regulations in promoting justice and protecting individual rights.

In the fiscal year 2023-24, the number of road accidents per one lakh population varied across districts. Shopian district reported the lowest road accidents, with 24.42 accidents per one lakh population, while Reasi and Samba district had the highest number of accidents, with 99.15 and 97.52 accidents per one lakh population respectively.



When it comes to crimes against women, Udhampur district reported the minimum incidence, with 38.79 crimes per one lakh women population, whereas Ganderbal, Budgam, Kulgam and Shopian districts had the highest incidence, with 187.10, 150.4, 147.42 and 118.89 crimes against women per one lakh population respectively. In terms of crimes against children, Shopian district reported lowest crimes 2.50 against its child population, while Kishtwar district followed by Baramulla had the highest incidence, with 34.22 and 31.62 crimes per one lakh child population respectively. Regarding conviction rates, 6 districts achieved a rate of over 60.7% to 78.5% with Udhampur district registering the highest conviction rate of 81.83% for the fiscal year 2023-24.



9. ENVIRONMENT

Preserving environment is not an option, it is an imperative and for that matter collective & individual efforts are required to protect the forest and reduce the pollution, promote sustainable resources management and engage in conservation efforts. Among other things extension of forest cover is one of the pillar to have a sustainable and environmentally conscious future. Over the past two years, there has been no change in forest cover in UT of J&K reported. Additionally, 4 districts, namely Srinagar, Shopian, Kishtwar, and Ganderbal, have achieved full protection of their water bodies and wetlands. These districts have implemented measures to safeguard and preserve these valuable natural resources, ensuring their long-term sustainability.

10. CITIZEN CENTRIC GOVERNANCE

Government of Jammu & Kashmir is committed to provide ease to its citizens by providing “online services”, “timely grievances redressal” & “conversion of Government Offices into e-Offices” to promote transparency, efficiency & Stability in the Governance System. By embracing technology and leveraging digital tools to streamline operations, enhance productivity and create more flexible work environments. This level of connectivity fosters teamwork and empowers employees to work effectively, irrespective of geographical barriers.



Over the past three years about 57% Government offices have been converted into e-Offices in the Union Territory of Jammu & Kashmir, which has increased the government working manifolds. In terms of grievance redressal, District Rajouri and Kulgam stands out as the districts to achieve a 100% grievance redressal percentage. 16 districts fall within the range of 80% to 99% grievance redressal, while district Budgam and Kishtwar lags behind with a percentage of 63.82% and 50.14% respectively. Regarding the provision of government services to citizens online, 5 districts, namely Srinagar, Doda, Kulgam, Jammu and Rajouri have successfully transitioned to



providing 100% of government services online. 14 districts have achieved a range of 80% to 99% online service delivery.

DGGI and Innovativeness: Fostering Good Governance

Good Governance is characterized by transparency, responsibility, accountability, participation, and responsiveness to the needs of the people. It necessitates the efficient utilization of all available resources - human, physical, and technological - in order to develop mechanisms that align goals, allocate resources, and empower decision-making authority for innovation across the District Administration, in line with the aspirations of the general public. Administrations that embody Good Governance are capable of effectively dealing with any situation, even with limited resources.

The effective functioning of governance is a primary concern for every citizen. Citizens are willing to pay for quality services offered by the government, but what is crucial is a transparent, accountable, and comprehensible governance system that is free from biases and prejudices. There is a pressing need to introduce innovativeness within the governance system to prioritize the Gandhian principle of 'Antyodaya,' which aims at restoring good governance. Efforts should also be directed towards instilling integrity in governance, thereby enhancing its ethical foundation. Good Governance will continue to be a crucial requirement for the ongoing and future reforms.

New approach to measure Good Governance

In an era marked by faster technological advancements and application of modern statistical tools, the traditional governance approaches are not sufficient to capture dynamic nature of governance. Recognizing the challenge, Government of Jammu & Kashmir switched over to the innovative method of District Good Governance Index and with all out-efforts of Jammu & Kashmir Administration, the District Good Governance Index which is the first of its kind in any state/UT in the country was launched in 2021-22 and subsequently dedicated portal to capture the data on the identified 10 sectors and 58 indicators of development was launched in January, 2022 as well.

Accountability & Transparency

To ensure transparency and accountability, Good Governance Index has influenced the policy makers, District Administration and all the stake holders involved in the development of the administrative unit by creating a strong sense of accountability. The indices judged with the tool of DGGI provided a systematic and standard frame work for evaluating the performances of district level implementing agencies responsible for the development of the particular sector. It also includes improvisation of existing Govt. interventions where stakeholders and administrators are made more responsible for their duties regarding optimal use of resources and able to deliver the services to the public efficiently. It has also created awareness in the public to comprehend and asses the performance of the government.

Release of DGGI Index (1.0, 2.0, 3.0 & 4.0)

With the successful release of four editions of DGGI, it is has become the most innovative tool for the district administration and other stakeholders to work on weak areas and bridge the gaps. The index encourages districts to adopt creative and innovative approaches to governance challenges on persistent basis, besides conducting periodic reviews and monitoring to judge the levels of the development that helps them to identify areas for improvement and their corrective measures.

Benefits of Adopting DGGI

DGGI gives the complete insight on major sectors like Agriculture and Allied, Industries and Allied Sectors, Human development, Public health, Public utility & infrastructure, Social welfare, financial inclusion, Legal & Public Safety, Environment and Citizen Centric Governance, having direct impact on the common masses. A distinguished feature of the Good Governance initiative is its emphasis on citizen centric approach, recognizing them as the key stakeholders in governance, therefore through online platforms citizens can voice their issues and provide feedback which contributes to the assessment of the Governance. Apart from other sectors, DGGI is also measured on citizen centric Governance which includes Grievance redressal, online services provided under public Guarantee act and conversion of Govt. offices to e-offices. All the districts are showing increasing trend over past few years.

Leveraging Technology for Data collection and Analysis

To measure the DGGI modern tools of technology have been put in place and large data is being collected on the specified indicators on online portal on every month which enhances the accuracy, speed and objective of governance assessment and improves the quality of data by its scrutiny at various levels.

With the launch of portal and documentation of the DGG index, that presents the governance assessment findings in a user-friendly manner and makes the complex governance data easier to understand to policy makers, administrators and other stakeholders and promotes data-driven-decision making and governance reform processes

Public awareness

Govt. Schemes and programmes are instrumental in addressing societal challenges, promoting Development and improving the wellbeing of its citizens. Monitoring and assessing the effective implementation of these programmes is crucial for assessing the progress. With the continual publication of DGGI now fourth in series created awareness amongst public, policy makers and administrators equally about the understanding the better governance practices. It helps the Govt to gauge the effectiveness of the schemes and identify areas where course of corrective measures or enhancements are required in plugging the loopholes impeding to achieve their objectives, targets and milestones within a specified period.

Positive impact /Creating Sense of Competition

District Good Governance Index (DGGI) has produced sense of competition amongst the Districts, as it has been observed from the past few years after the introduction of DGGI, Districts Administration make more efforts to improve their rankings and focus on improving public service delivery, promoting innovations and strengthening institutional capacities. The index incentivizes district administration and all the stakeholders about the improvisation of the Governance which ultimately benefits population. The index also facilitates the sharing of best practices among the districts, creating a collaborative environment through which successful practices in the implementation of various programme are being replicated and adopted.

Public perception and confidence

DGGI rankings definitely influence public perception and confidence in district authorities, as high rankings indicate efficient and transparent governance practices, thereby generating positives of the authorities at the helm of affairs among citizens. This will yield more positive results as the public confidence grows, public is more likely to work with district administration in resolving issues impeding the developmental process.

Way Ahead

Building good governance relies on the quality of organization and personal interest and ability to provide strong leadership to steer the initiatives for the welfare of general masses. Administrative capacity plays a pivotal role in delivering essential services to the public, fostering economic progress, and promoting social cohesion. Proficient system clubbed with transparent mechanism play its own role in effective delivery mechanism. This needs to be clubbed with sustainable and long lasting benefits of the society in the long run.

By embracing innovativeness in governance, we can further advance the principles of Good Governance, ensure sustainable development, and meet the evolving needs of our society.

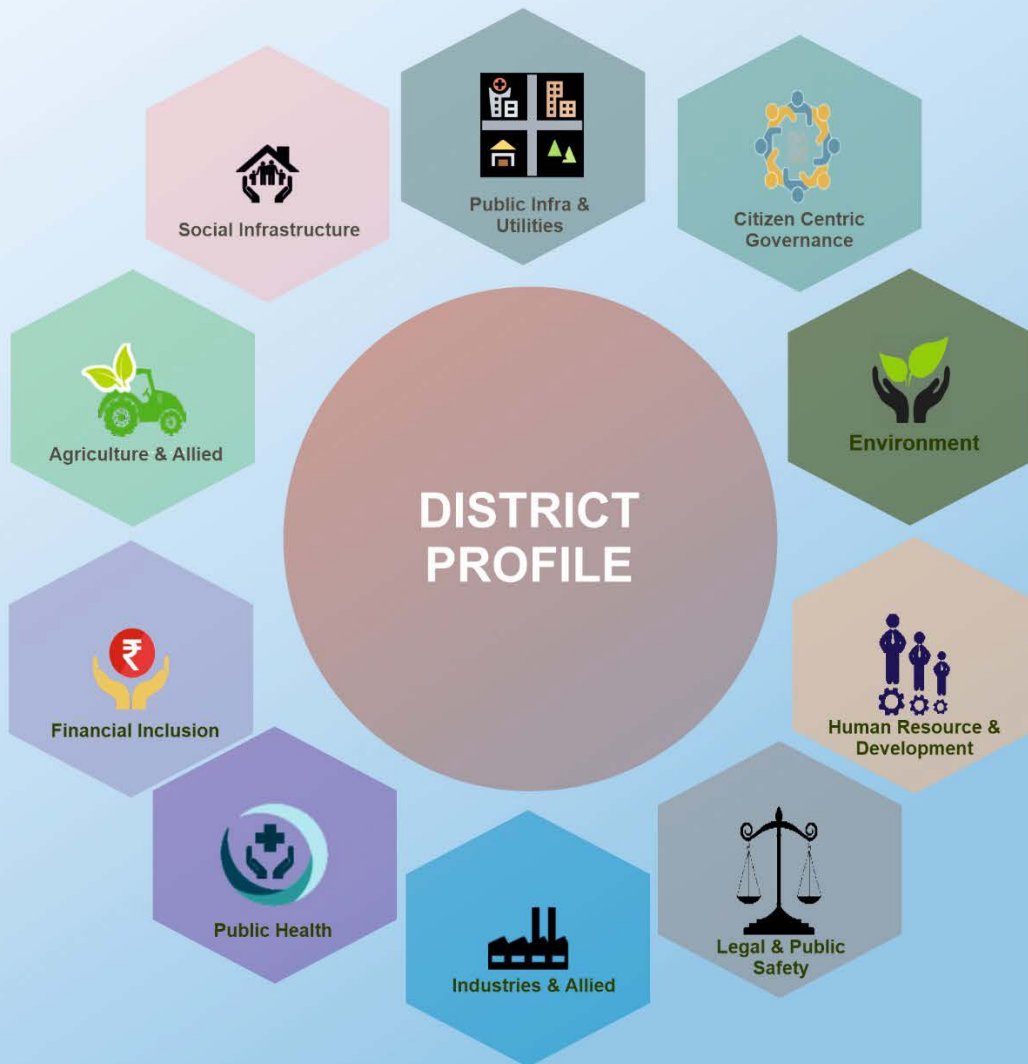
Enhancing Scope of DGGI

There is always scope for further improvement in any initiative. The department intends to enhance its scope and utility to make it more broad based and inclusive by including additional indicators, depending upon the availability and suitability of indicators across the districts.

Improvisation of DGG Portal/Dashboard

The DGG Portal/dashboard is a crucial tool for computing indices and assessing governance performance. The roadmap entails improving the monthly portal/dashboard to make it more comprehensive and relevant. One approach is to explore the possibility of linking the DGG dashboard with other portals or platforms that offer related data and information. This integration would enhance the richness and accuracy of the indices calculated through DGGI. Secondly, the annual DGGI is also being linked to the monthly DGG portal for consistent monitoring by the District administration for improving public service delivery mechanism.

District Jammu derives its name from the City of Jammu which caters as winter Capital of Jammu and Kashmir, UT and falls under Category 'B'. The City of Jammu is also known as City of Temples. Raja Jamboo Lochan is believed to have founded this city in fourteen century B.C. On witnessing an extraordinary phenomenon of a tiger and a goat drinking water from one and the same pond he decided to build a city "Jamboo" at this site so that the strong and weak could live together in peace and mutual tolerance.

It is located 74 degree 24' and 75 degree 18', East longitude and 32 degree 50' and 33 degree 30' North latitude. It is approximately 600 kms away from the National Capital, New Delhi. Jammu district is spread over an area 2342 sq. kms and has a population of about 15.29 lakhs. It is the largest populated district of the UT. The District Jammu comprises of 21 Tehsils, 20 CD Blocks and 305 Panchayats with 915 revenue villages.



The No. of Males and Females in the District is of the order of 8.13 lacs and 7.16 lacs respectively and the sex ratio of the district is 880.

The population density per sq km in the district is 653 which is the highest in the Union Territory.

District Shopian came into existence administratively in April-2007. It has been carved out of erstwhile District Pulwama. Shopian district is located in the southern part of Kashmir Valley and bounded by Pulwama, Kulgam, Anantnag Districts. Shopian is a hill District and the historical road known as Mughal Road passes through the District.

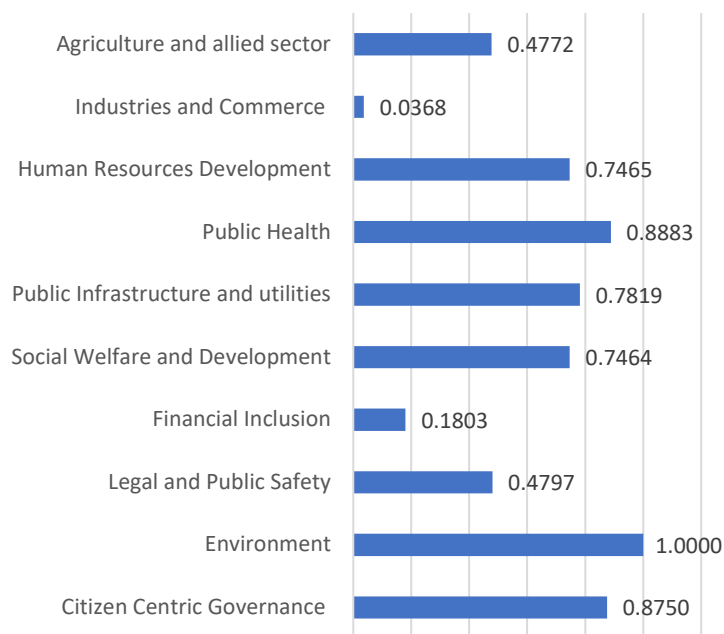
District Shopian is administratively divided into 7 Tehsils, 9 CD Blocks with 98 Halqa Panchayats and 239 revenue villages.

The Ganderbal town is the District Headquarter and has derived its name from a famous spring Ganderbhavan with the passage of time, the name got changed into Ganderbal. Historically, Ganderbal acted as gateway to the Central Asia by constituting one of the most important station of the erstwhile Silk-Route.

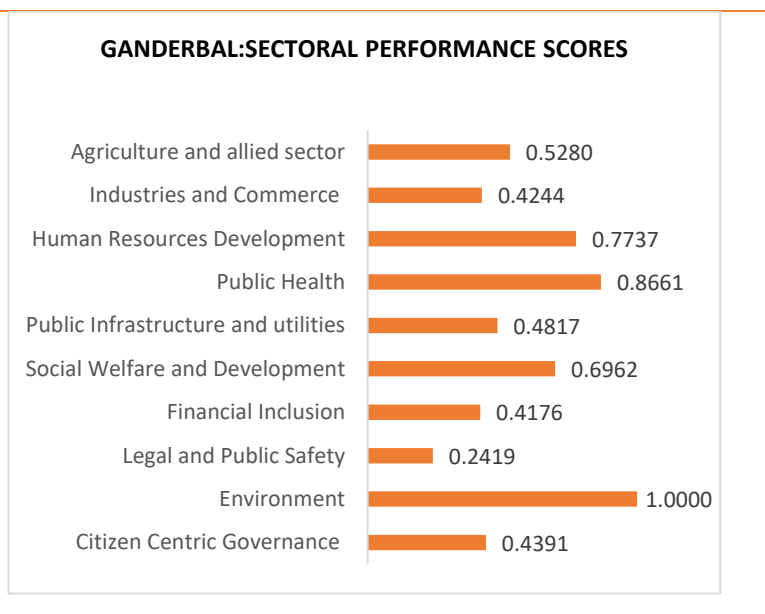
The District Ganderbal is located between 34.23° N Latitude and 74.78° E Longitude on the North of District Srinagar from which it was carved out in 2007. It mostly stretches from south – west to North-east with a length of 125 kms and this stretch has a width of around 10-20 kms at an elevation of 1650 to 3000 meters above the Mean Sea Level (MSL). Nearly 70% area of the District is hilly and semi-hilly.

Administratively, the District Ganderbal is divided into 6 Tehsils, 7 CD Blocks with 126 Panchayats and 139 revenue villages. River Sindh traverses a course of about 100 kms through the District with a basin exceeding 1556 Sq kms. The district covers the entire water shed of the river so the Sindh valley and the District has become synonymous.

The District Ganderbal holds some of the sacred pilgrimage sites like serene spring of famous Shri Mata Kherbhawani Durga Temple and Qamar Sahib and Baba Hyder(RA) Tullamula. An easy approach through Baltal to Shri Amarnathji cave has made the District World renowned. With the presence of tourist resort Sonamarg and Mansbal lake on its fringes and Sindh stream adding its importance & charm can contribute to the emergence of this area both as religious tourist destinations and recreational activities.

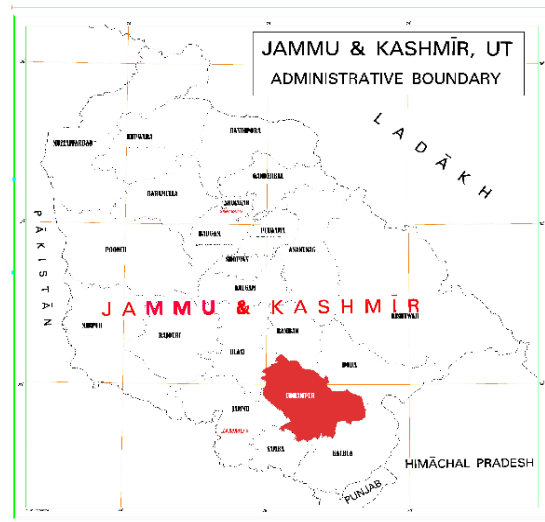

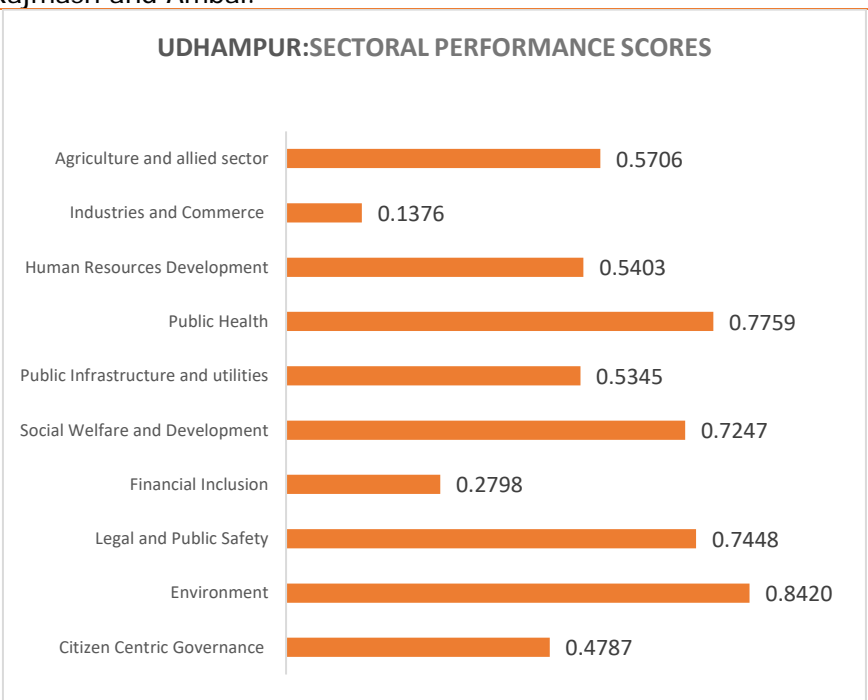

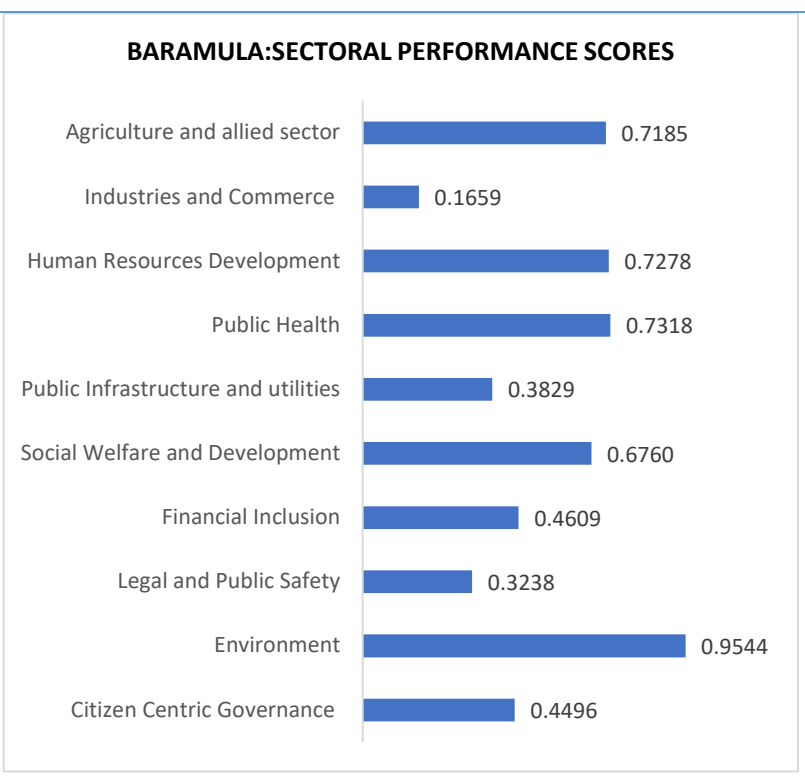

Baramulla district is situated in the north-west of the UT of Jammu & Kashmir. The District Administration is headquartered at the town of Baramulla. Poonch is multi cultured, multi religious in nature having diversified population. Poonch is having rich culture, customs and traditions.

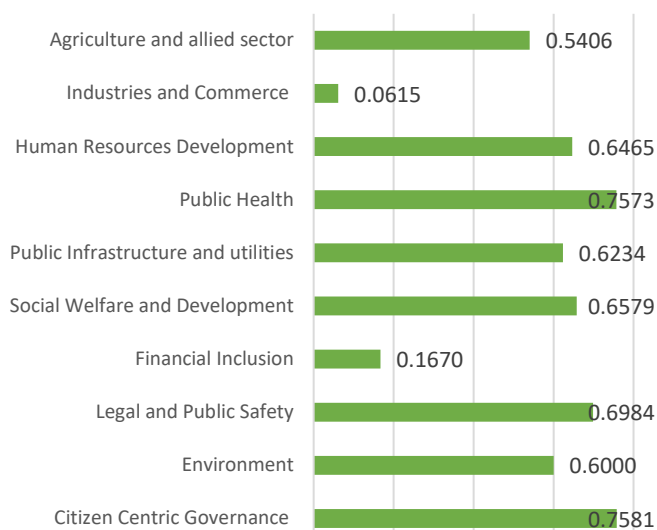

District Kupwara has been carved out of erstwhile Baramulla District in the year 1979. The geographical area of the District is 2379 sq.kms out of which forest area being reported as 1534.52 sqkm. The average temperature is ranging from -10 degree Celsius to 37 degree Celcius. The District is situated at an altitude of 5300 ft. above sea level. In the east and south, there are district boundaries of Baramulla and in the west line of control (LOC) separating it from POJK. It is about 97 Kms from Srinagar (Summer Capital of J&K UT) and well connected through road network. There are some famous passes of Himalayan range like Sadhna Top (Nastachen Gali) connecting Karnah Sub Division with District HQ and others like Tootmar Gali, Farkiyani Gali and Zamindar Gali (Z.Gali) connecting Leepa valley(POK), Keran and Machil areas with Kupwara District. The Kishan Ganga River, a major river other than Jhelum passing through the district.



Kupwara district is surrounded by thick forests, mountain slopes and snow-clad peaks from three sides. The district is dotted by magnificent and breathtaking natural beauty and has a great potential of tourist traffic. The district is famous for beautiful tourist places viz, Bungus Valley, Lolab Valley, Drangyar, Teetwal, Keran and Machil valley & other health resorts, famous in eco-tourism, adventure-tourism and border-tourism because of its natural scenery, climate and topography. Administratively, District Kupwara is divided into 16 Tehsils, 24 CD Blocks with 385 Halqa Panchayats and 379 revenue villages. Agriculture is the main source of livelihood in Kupwara. It is also rich in forest.

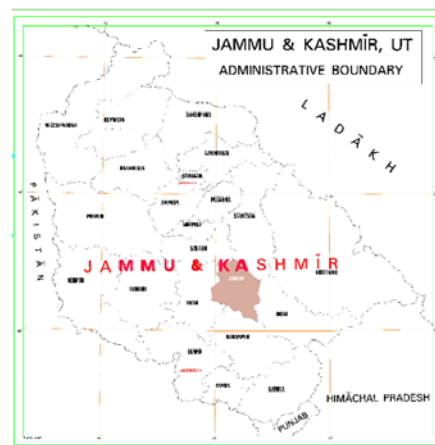

District Ramban is located in the lap of Pir-Panjal Mountains. Ramban contains numerous Valleys created by the River Chenab along with its several tributaries. The district has an average elevation of 3792 ft. above mean sea level (MSL) and is flanked by beautiful tourist spots. Ramban shares its boundary with Reasi, Udhampur, Doda, Anantnag and Kulgam districts. It is also a gateway to the valley of Kashmir.

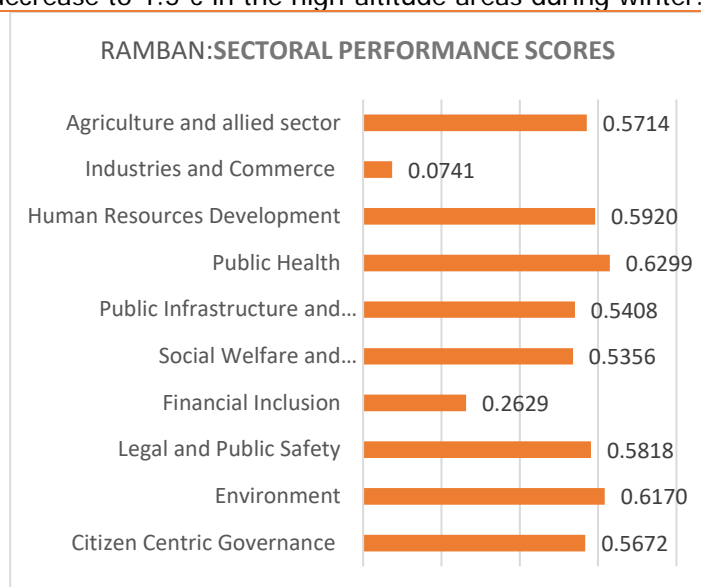
District Ramban comprises of 8 Tehsils, 11 CD Blocks with 143 Halqa Panchayats and 172 revenue villages.

Ramban is on the cusp of glory after completion of two prestigious National Projects – Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla Rail Link (USBRL) & Four-Laning of Jammu-Srinagar National Highway (now NH-44) Projects. These National Projects shall annihilate distances and elevate Ramban's strategic position as the most ideally located districts in J&K UT, where almost all the Divisions and majority of the districts are equidistant. It has a major hydroelectric project known as Baglihar Dam. Agriculture, Horticulture and Tourism industries play a significant role in income generation. With agriculture and allied sectors remaining the core sectors of development, Ramban envisages itself towards saturating various Government Schemes and benchmark practices to increase volume and penetrate newer markets for its products with 'organic' being its key Unique Selling Proposition (USP).

The climate of the District varies according to the altitude. The temperature increases as high as 42°C during summer in the low-lying areas and decrease to 1.5°C in the high-altitude areas during winter.

Performance of data in agriculture and allied activities across various districts in the UT of Jammu and Kashmir, focusing on key metrics such as food and horticulture production, milk and meat output, and poultry production shows yields for food production vary significantly, with Bandipora showing the highest yield at 28.51 and Ramban the lowest at 10.25. In terms of horticulture, Baramula leads with a yield of 17.28, while Jammu lags behind at 2.31. Milk

production per person is highest in Kulgam at 354.65, contrasting sharply with Srinagar's low of 73.36. Access to agricultural markets, as indicated by the percentage of Mandies linked, is excellent in Budgam and Baramula, achieving 100%, yet some districts like Kishtwar and Poonch show significant gaps in crop insurance and agricultural credit access, highlighting areas needing improvement. Vaccination rates for livestock are commendably high across most districts, particularly in Anantnag and Bandipora, reflecting effective animal health management. However, the overall performance of the UT falls short of many targets, especially in food and poultry production, suggesting substantial room for growth and enhancement in agricultural practices.

Anantnag leads with a high GST collection rate of 89.39% and perfect scores in MSME and self-employment credit. Budgam, while achieving a full score in MSME, shows lower values in GST (15.91%) and remarkable change of 168.51% in tourist footfall over the previous year, indicating potential areas for growth. Baramula excels with 100% in MSME credit. Conversely, Kishtwar and Poonch demonstrate challenges, with Kishtwar having the lowest MSME score at 26.17% and Poonch showing a satisfactory tourist engagement with change of 89.75% as compared to previous year. District Doda excels in attracting tourist footfall with commendable change of 539.50% over the last year. Overall, the UT averages 39.62% for GST, 71.72% for MSME, and 82.00% for credit to handicrafts, falling short of the ambitious targets of 100% across all categories.

The data shows a detailed overview of human resources development across various districts in the UT of Jammu and Kashmir, focusing on key metrics such as gender parity, retention rates, and enrollment for scheduled castes (SC) and scheduled tribes (ST), along with pupil-teacher ratios, school facilities, access to computers, mid-day meals (MDM), and skill training opportunities. The data shows that Anantnag, Budgam, Bandipora, and Pulwama maintain strong gender parity ratios close to 1, while Kulgam slightly exceeds this at 1.02, indicating a favorable environment for gender balance in education. Retention rates are generally high, with Pulwama achieving a perfect score of 100%, while Srinagar shows a lower rate of 64.71%.

Enrollment figures for SC and ST students vary widely, with Jammu leading at 25.63% for SCs, but overall, enrollment remains low across many districts. The pupil-teacher ratio is relatively favorable, with most districts maintaining a ratio around 1:15, although some, like Ramban, report a less favorable ratio of 1:23. School facilities are generally strong, with most districts reporting over 80% access to necessary facilities and a high percentage of schools providing mid-day meals. The provision of computers in schools also shows promising numbers, particularly in Shopian, where 100% of schools have computer access. Overall, the UT of Jammu and Kashmir averages 0.94 for gender parity, 92.24% for retention rates, and an 8.56% enrollment rate for SC students, with ambitious targets set at 100% across various metrics.

The data indicates a generally strong performance in immunization and institutional delivery, with many districts achieving 100% immunization coverage. Anantnag and Shopian report exemplary institutional delivery rates of 100%, reflecting effective maternal health services.

While the average IMR for the UT is 3.95, Bandipora reports a notably high rate of 8.00, raising concerns about infant health in that district. The MMR averages at 28.43, with Baramula showing a concerning figure of 143.00, suggesting critical areas for improvement in maternal health care. Districts like Jammu and Ganderbal report lower MMRs, demonstrating better outcomes in maternal health. Access to essential health services, such as PHCs and anganwadi centers, is commendable, with most districts achieving above 70% availability, although some districts like Kishtwar and Poonch show lower numbers.

Overall, the UT averages strong indicators for immunization (100%) and institutional delivery (92.50%), though it falls short of the targets for MMR and IMR.

The performance data provides a detailed analysis of public infrastructure and utilities across various districts in the UT of Jammu and Kashmir, focusing on metrics such as the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (PMAY) implementation, access to drinking water, sanitation, electrification, the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY) for rural roads, and the availability of black-top roads. Anantnag stands out with strong figures in drinking water (87.03%) and sanitation (100%), alongside full electrification. Bandipora and Kulgam also report high sanitation rates, both achieving 100%. Notably, Srinagar shows remarkable performance across various metrics, particularly in PMAY (95.59%) and full electrification. In contrast, Ganderbal excels in drinking water access, achieving 100%, but has a lower PMAY score at 54.99%.

Districts such as Kupwara and Ramban exhibit high PMAY implementation rates (92.16% and 99.82%, respectively), reflecting effective housing schemes. However, challenges remain; for example, Budgam has lower drinking water access at 50.70% despite high sanitation coverage. Overall, the UT averages 74% for PMAY, 79% for drinking water, and 99% for sanitation, although it falls short of the target of 100% across all categories.

The table provides a comprehensive overview of social welfare and development indicators across various districts in the UT of Jammu and Kashmir, focusing on key metrics such as the issuance of Aadhaar cards, offtake of grains, participation in the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA), enrollment in the Atal Pension Yojana, coverage of the Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana (PMSBY), and the National Social Assistance Program (NSAP).

Overall, the performance is impressive, particularly in the issuance of Aadhaar cards, with all districts achieving a remarkable 100% coverage. However, the offtake of grains shows a more varied picture, with an average of 89% across the UT, suggesting room for improvement in food security measures. Participation in MGNREGA is notably lower, with an average of 38%, highlighting the need for enhanced outreach and engagement to ensure that rural populations can benefit from guaranteed employment. In contrast, the Atal Pension Yojana shows a more promising uptake at an average of 66%, though some districts, like Budgam (30.92%), fall significantly short.

Coverage under PMSBY and NSAP is commendable, averaging 69% and 99.67%, respectively. This reflects a strong commitment to providing social security and assistance to vulnerable populations, although there are discrepancies in coverage among districts. For example, Kupwara excels in PMSBY with full coverage, while Ramban lags behind with only 23.08% participation. In summary, while the UT shows commendable progress in several areas, particularly Aadhaar registration and social assistance programs, targeted efforts are needed to improve participation in employment schemes and food security initiatives.

The table on financial inclusion across the districts of Jammu and Kashmir presents key metrics related to the Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana, Mudra loans, and self-employment initiatives. Overall, the performance indicates a mixed but promising picture. The average percentage of Jan Dhan accounts across the UT stands at 52%, reflecting a significant level of engagement but also highlighting a need for further outreach to achieve the target of 100%. Districts

like Baramula (77.68%) and Samba (74.94%) show relatively high performance, while Srinagar (23.41%) and Poonch (32.45%) lag behind.

In terms of Mudra loans, the performance is impressive, with an average of 94% across the UT, suggesting effective implementation of the program aimed at supporting small businesses and self-employment ventures. Districts like Ganderbal (93.14%) and Kupwara (100%) exemplify strong uptake, while Budgam (90.27%) also performs well.

Self-employment metrics are particularly strong, with an overall average of 97%, indicating that many districts are successfully facilitating entrepreneurship among their populations. Notably, Kulgam, Kupwara, Pulwama, and others report 100% in self-employment, showcasing successful initiatives in creating sustainable livelihoods.

The data on judiciary and public safety across Jammu and Kashmir's districts reveals significant insights into road safety, crime rates, and the effectiveness of the judicial system.

In terms of road accidents, Jammu stands out with the highest number at 1,094 incidents, which significantly exceeds the average of 303 incidents per district. Anantnag (308) and Udhampur (468) also report high numbers, indicating a pressing need for enhanced road safety measures. When examining crimes against women, Budgam (285) has the highest incidence, followed by Baramula (248) and Srinagar (270), signalling critical areas for intervention and support for victims. The overall average for crimes against women in the UT is 147, highlighting the need for increased safety measures and public awareness.

For crimes against children, the statistics are concerning yet vary widely. Anantnag leads with 54 reported cases, while Kulgam reports only 4. The average of 37 cases per district indicates that protective measures for children are crucial across the region.

The conviction rates present a mixed picture, with some districts showing strong performance. Ramban (79) and Udhampur (82) exhibit higher conviction rates, suggesting

effective judicial processes. However, districts like Ganderbal (0) and Srinagar (3) raise concerns about the efficacy of the legal system in these areas.

Overall, while there are areas of progress, the data underscores the need for comprehensive strategies to address road safety, bolster protections for women and children, and improve the overall efficiency of the judicial system in Jammu and Kashmir.

Water Bodies: Ganderbal and Shopian stand out with a remarkable 100% coverage of water bodies, reflecting the region's abundance of freshwater resources. Budgam (97.62%) and Pulwama (98.17%) also report high percentages, suggesting a rich hydrological landscape. Anantnag, while having a substantial water body coverage of 52.16%, still shows potential for enhancement.

The overall performance for the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir shows 43.42% forest cover and 86.21% water body availability, exceeding the target of 33% for forest cover and achieving the goal for water bodies. Grievance Redressal: Kulgam stands out with a perfect score of 100%, indicating that all grievances are effectively addressed. Other districts performing well include Kupwara (91.43%) and Rajouri (100%). This reflects a strong commitment to responsive governance across several regions. Conversely, Kishtwar shows room for improvement with a score of 50.41%.

Services Act: Kulgam again excels with a full score of 100%, along with Doda, Jammu, and Srinagar also achieving similar marks. These districts demonstrate robust implementation of service delivery mechanisms. In contrast, Kathua lags with a score of 79.39%, indicating potential areas for enhancement.

E-Office: The adaptation of digital governance varies significantly among districts. Pulwama, Shopian, and Reasi lead with a perfect 100%, showcasing a commitment to digitalization in governance. On the other hand, Kupwara struggles with only 6.67%, indicating a need for better integration of technology in administrative processes.

Overall, the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir has an average performance of 91.83% in grievance redressal, 92.73% in services act implementation, and 56.85% in e-office adoption. While the targets for grievance redressal and services act implementation are close to being met, there remains a notable gap in e-office integration, signalling an opportunity for further investment in digital infrastructure.

Chapter 7

Approach and Methodology

The first edition of District Good Governance Index (DGGI) of the UT of Jammu and Kashmir which was launched in January 2022, was developed by the Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances, GoI in collaboration with the Institute of Management Public and Rural Administration using 58 indicators from 10 Governance sectors. The technical support for construction of Index was provided by the Centre for Good Governance, Hyderabad whereas the data was facilitated by the Directorate of Economics and Statistics, J&K. The selection of indicators was done after having extensive consultations with the senior officers of the DARPG, GoI and UT Government. Broadly, the following principles governed in finalizing the indicators:

- Simple and measurable
- Output and outcome oriented
- Applicability across the districts
- Primarily controlled by the districts

The process for identification of indicators, used in the DGGI 1.0, & 2.0 has gone through extensive consultations with senior officers of DARPG, GoI and UT of Jammu and Kashmir in a series of meetings, accordingly, the same set of 58 indicators across 10 sectors along-with the methodology adopted for construction of Index, have been used for DGGI 3.0.

Components of District Good Governance Index Framework

The following 58 Indicators clubbed as part of 1.0 have been adopted for DGGI 2.0 of Jammu 10 Sectors finalized during the process of DGGI and Kashmir.

Methodology for Construction of DGGI

This section provides details about data capture from various sources of data and the process followed for calculating sector and indicator-wise scores for final ranking of the Districts as described below:-

Step I: Compilation of Necessary Data/ Information

Computation of scores for different indicators under 10 sectors prescribed in the DGGI Framework requires data on a large number of facets covering various aspects of governance at district level. To begin with, the index implementing agency needs to fix the reference year for ranking the Districts for data compilation purpose. Particularly, for growth-based indicators, data has to be compiled for three (at least) or five years (to be decided based on the data availability) preceding the reference year. The reference year used for growth based indicators in the DGGI 1.0 has been kept intact i.e. 2018-19. The data for this purpose has been collected from the District Development Commissioners.

Step II: Normalization of Indicator Values

Statistically, there is no sanity in comparing variables which are expressed in different units. Therefore, it is required to convert the variables with mixed scales into dimensionless entities, so that they can be compared and used for ranking purpose easily. This way of conversion is known as **normalization**. It helps in measuring and comparing composite indicators with ease. It also makes the aggregation of indicators meaningful. There are various methods available to normalize variables and attain scores for the Districts based on their performance on the identified indicators for compiling sector-wise/district-wise ranking. For the purpose of ranking the Districts as part of DGGI, the Dimensional Index Methodology is proposed to be used.

Dimensional Index Method is most commonly used for normalization of values and subsequent ranking. In this method, the normalized value of each indicator is obtained by subtracting the minimum value among these from the raw value of indicators and then dividing it by the data range (maximum – minimum value). The maximum and minimum values for each indicator are ascertained based on the raw values for that indicator across the Districts – combining all Districts without considering the existing Divisional (Jammu and Kashmir Divisions) categorization. This approach is specifically adopted so that such calculation would permit comparison across all Districts and can also be used for generating overall ranks – without considering the categorization.

The following two equations have been used to normalise the indicator values:

Dimensional Score for Positive Indicators:

$$\text{Score} = \frac{(\text{Indicator Value} - \text{Minimum Value})}{(\text{Maximum Value} - \text{Minimum Value})}$$

Dimensional Score for Negative Indicators:

$$\text{Score} = \frac{(\text{Maximum Value} - \text{Indicator Value})}{(\text{Maximum Value} - \text{Minimum Value})}$$

Where

Positive Indicator = for which Higher Value is better

Negative Indicator = for which Lower Value is better

Indicator Value = Available through Secondary Sources

Maximum Value = Highest Indicator Value among the Districts

Minimum Value = Lowest Indicator Value among the Districts

The above-mentioned equations has been used after calculating Compound Annual Growth Rate (CAGR) over base year to reference year directly by taking the values of indicators for reference year. In case of the growth-based indicators, this exercise has been undertaken for each indicator.

The following equation has been used for calculating CAGR:

$$CAGR = \left(\frac{\text{value of Reference Year}}{\text{value of Base Year}} \right)^{\left(\frac{1}{n}\right)-1} \times 100$$

where: n = number of periods

Step III: Assigning Weightages

Equal Weightage to Sectors:

As mentioned earlier, while conceptualizing DGGI, various aspects of governance, which are critical for growth, development and inclusiveness need to be measured, have been clustered under ten sectors. All the identified ten sectors are facets of equal importance from the point of view of citizen-centric approach for such comprehensive index at District level.

In addition, there is a possibility that during a particular period, one District might be more focused and channelizing its resources towards some limited prioritized sectors due to issues of area specific importance. And, at the same time, there is a possibility that one District might be giving equal importance to all sectors at once allocating resources equally/ proportionately. In such scenarios, there would definitely be a difference in outcomes achieved by either of the Districts. In such circumstances, the index should not provide any advantage or disadvantage to Districts for ranking purpose. Therefore, it is decided to give equal weightage to all sectors irrespective of the approach followed for ranking.

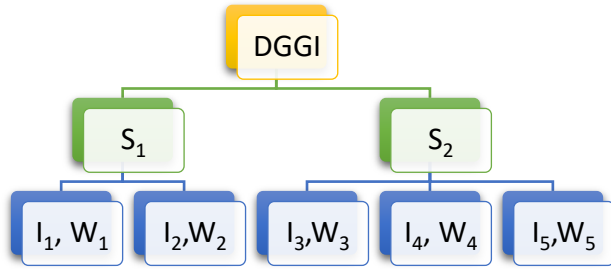
Differential Weightages for Indicators:

As already mentioned that outcome / output-based indicators were given priority for indicator selection and at the same time selection was restricted due to availability of data. Therefore, the outcome / output-based indicators are assigned higher weightage whereas proxy indicators (input/process-based) are assigned lower weightage. Assigning higher weightages to outcome/output-based indicators brings the focus on performance and achievements of the Districts.

Step IV: Computation of Scores and Ranking

After completing data normalization process, the normalized value of each indicator needs to be multiplied with weightage assigned to the indicator in order to obtain the final indicator score. These final individual indicator scores are aggregated to obtain a value for the sector. These aggregated values after multiplication with sector weight becomes the score for the sector and once sector wise scores are aggregated, it becomes District's DGGI Score to be used for ranking purpose.

Methodology to Measure District Performance (Indicator-wise)

To assess the performance of the district across various indicators, specific targets have been established for many of these indicators. For some indicators, national targets have been adopted, while for others, health and human resource-related targets are aligned with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Targets are generally set as percentages, and performance is evaluated based on the percentage achieved. In certain cases, productivity is measured against national targets to be met. In other instances, the highest achievements recorded serve as the benchmark for the targets.

It is important to note that the primary focus of this approach is to measure improvements within the district relative to these established targets.

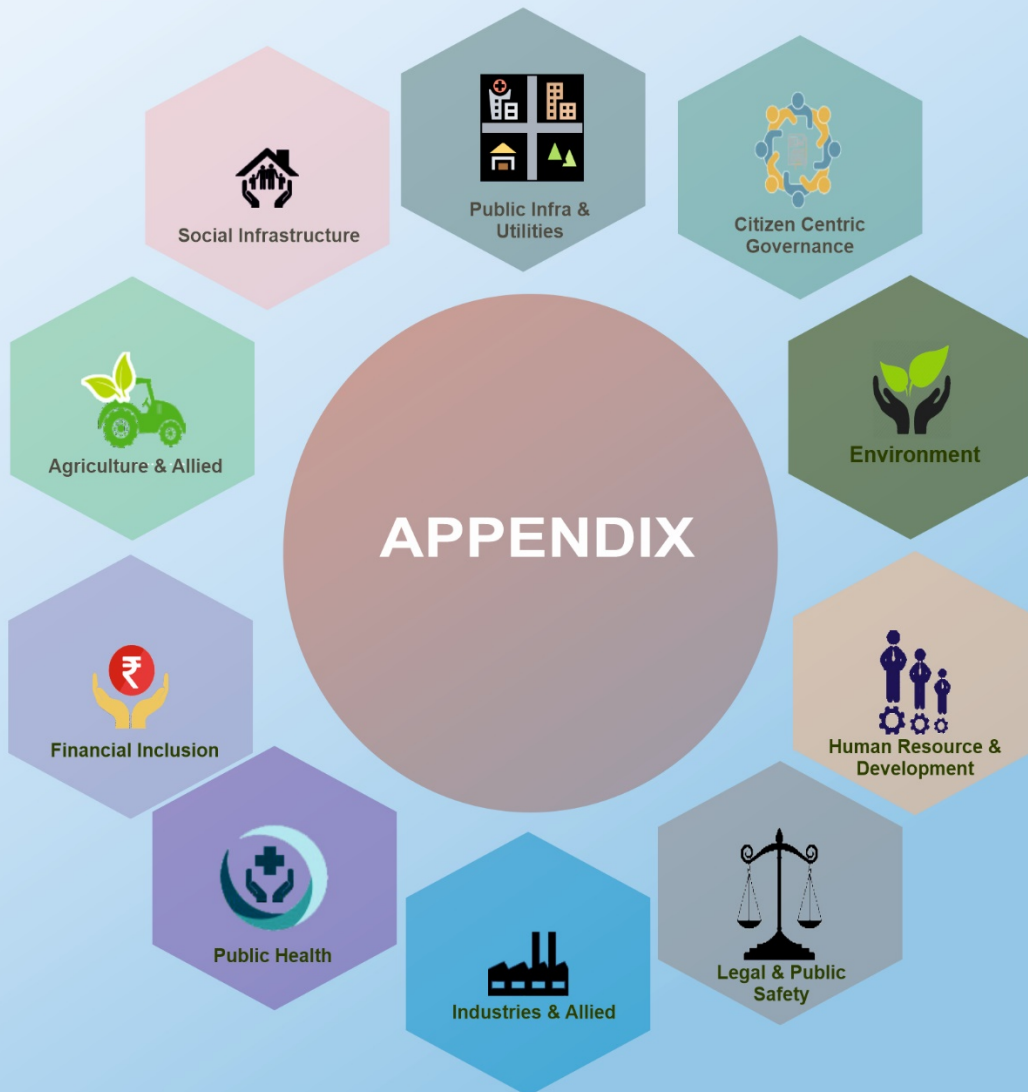
