

PRIME MINISTERS' DEVELOPMENT PACKAGE (PMDP-2015)

The Prime Minister's Development Package (PMDP) for Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, announced on November 7, 2015, is a comprehensive Reconstruction Plan with a financial outlay of Rs. 80,068 Crore. The plan is designed around five key pillars:

- 1. Humanitarian Relief**
- 2. Crisis Management**
- 3. Social Infrastructure**
- 4. Development Projects**
- 5. Economic Infrastructure**

Initially, the PMDP comprised 63 projects. Following the reorganization of Jammu & Kashmir into a Union Territory, 53 projects remained applicable to J&K UT. As of November, 2025, significant progress has been made, with 29 projects (9 by the Government of India and 20 by the Government of Jammu & Kashmir) completed, and 14 projects (4 by GoI, 10 by GoJK) stands substantially completed. Collectively, this represents 81.13% of the total projects.

Key Achievements:

- Completion Rate:** 81.13% of the total projects are either completed or substantially completed.
- Funds Utilized:** A total of Rs. 56,946.58 crore has been released for the 53 projects. As of November 2025, Rs. 54,986.17 crore (96.56% of the released amount) has been expended.

Key Challenges Addressed:

- Land acquisition
- Forest clearances
- Utility shifting
- Ongoing legal proceedings

These efforts have been crucial in overcoming potential hurdles and ensuring the projects progress smoothly.
